Chora, Monastery of Saint John the Theologian and the Cave of the Apocalypse

After leaving the Cave, you will drive to the historic village of Chora, perched atop a hill, where you'll have the chance to capture breathtaking panoramic views of the island and explore the stunning architecture of homes dating back to the 15th to 18th centuries.
