Hilltowns of Istria (extra expense) < br /> Depart from the pier and take in the stunning scenery as you journey to the charming hilltop village of Motovun. After approximately 90 minutes, you will arrive at the parking area, where you will disembark your motor coach and board a local shuttle bus that will take you to the entrance of this Croatian gem. At the top, you will be greeted by a breathtaking Romanesque-Gothic bell tower dating back to the 13th century. From this elevated perspective, admire the panoramic views of the Mirna Valley and Motovun Forest. As you explore the village, immerse yourself in the rich local history, with landmarks dating back to the 12th century, including the Romanesque Municipal Palace, the largest secular structure of its era in Istria. After your guided tour, return via shuttle bus to the parking area, where your motor coach waits for scenic travels along narrow roads and across a plateau to the picturesque town of Oprtalj. Resembling a Tuscan village with its hilltop perch and rows of cypress trees, Oprtalj is celebrated as one of the most beautiful towns in Northern Istria. Once fortified by city walls, it now invites visitors to explore its many historical sites, including the parish church of St. George, built in 1526, two charming churches adorned with frescoes, and the impressive Venetian loggia. Next, proceed to the third hilltop town of the day, Groznjan. It is recognized as a vibrant cultural hub, particularly in the

summer when it comes alive with music academies, workshops, and artistic performances.

As you stroll, your guide will share fascinating insights into the history of Venice, highlighting the powerful figures who once inhabited these remarkable buildings. Marvel at the impressive Marciana Library, the Loggetta designed by J. Sansovino, the towering belltower, the clocktower adorned with its two bronze Moors, and the striking wings known as Procuratie Vecchie and Procuratie Nuove, all framed by the Cathedral in the beautiful daylight. Adjacent to the cathedral stands the magnificent Doges' Palace, the historical residence of the Doges of Venice, celebrated as one of the finest examples of Gothic architecture, with its exquisite façade and intricate loggias. Next, you'll see the iconic Ponte dei Sospiri, or Bridge of Sighs, which connects the palace to the former ducal prison, steeped in legend and history. Your guide will navigate you through the charming narrow streets (Calli) of Venice, leading you to the Grand Canal with a breathtaking view of the Rialto Bridge, the largest and most iconic of the four bridges that cross the canal.

br />Immerse yourself in the natural splendour of Croatia with a visit to Krka National Park, enhanced by a tranquil boat ride.Encompassing 142 square miles, this park safeguards the mesmerizing middle and lower stretches of the Krka River. Witness the river's journey through a canyon, culminating in breathtaking waterfalls, lakes, and rapids. Explore the highlight of the park, Skradinski Buk, featuring the largest waterfall at 147 feet, cascading down 17 steps—a renowned gem in European waterfalls. Enjoy

panoramic views, a small ethnological exhibition, and an operational old grinding mill above the falls. Conclude your adventure with a scenic half-hour boat ride along the Krka River from Skradinski Buk to the charming town of Skradin. Enjoy some free time in Skradin before returning to the ship.

/>A panoramic drive through the town of Split brings you to the Mestrovic Gallery. Ivan Mestrovic is the greatest Croatian sculptor of all time, and a large part of his impressive work is displayed here in his house, which is also a gallery. Continue to the Old Town of Split that is built on and around the spectacular 4th-century Roman Palace of the Emperor Diocletian. Your walking tour starts with a visit to the Palace's cellars, which are still very well preserved. They offer a fine glimpse of how the life in the Palace was organized. You will also see the very interesting Cathedral of St Duje (patron saint of the city), the charming Temple of Jupiter and view other landmarks such as the Golden Gate, the Silver Gate and Peristyle Square from the outside.

Our tour kicks off with a picturesque drive to the quaint town of Primosten. This delightful locale is an island linked to the mainland by a causeway and is renowned for its charming stone houses and narrow cobblestone streets. Upon arrival, you will have the chance to join your guide for a brief walking tour of the town, followed by some leisure time to explore on your own. Next, head to the village of Burni, where many homes date back several centuries. Immerse yourself in the essence of this traditional Dalmatian village with a visit to the Jurlinovi Dvori family farmhouse. You will be welcomed by your host, Don Stipe Perkov, who will share captivating stories about family customs and traditions. The farmhouse features a 'tineja' (dining room), a 'Konoba' (cellar), a 'kuzina' (kitchen), a museum showcasing farming tools and artifacts, as well as a chapel adorned with stunning stained-glass windows crafted by the German artist Edith Maria Heinze. During your visit, enjoy delectable local treats,

including smoked ham, cheese, and bread, all complemented by a glass of wine.

Day 12: Vis Island (Croatia)

The island of Vis, off the Croatian mainland, was closed to visitors until 1989. This has given Vis a rare sense of peace and authenticity. Its rocky coastline, azure waters and Venetian architecture made it the ideal backdrop of the film 'Mamma Mia! Here We Go Again.' (2018). As the afternoon rolls in, it's time to set sail to Hvar. DiscoverMOREcbr />Komiza tour (extra expense)
Your island adventure kicks off with a scenic coach ride to a breathtaking viewpoint, where you'll be treated to stunning panoramic views. After a brief stop to capture some photographs, you'll continue your journey, passing picturesque vineyards on your way to Hum, the highest point on Vis at 1,925 feet. Take a moment here to enjoy the sweeping vistas of the island, including a glimpse of the former WWII Royal Air Force (RAF) airstrip. Next, you'll visit the base of the hill that hosts Tito's Cave, a significant hideout and headquarters for Josip Broz Tito, the resistance leader and Yugoslavian President. This cave consists of two chambers equipped with the essentials, serving as Tito's residence and operational base during the final year of the war, where he coordinated the efforts of the Partisan army and managed his government. If you're up for it, you can climb the roughly 300 steps to explore the cave and fully appreciate its historical significance. Afterward, you'll reunite with your coach for a drive to Komiza, one of Croatia's most charming island villages, renowned for its rich fishing traditions. While there, you can explore a small fishermen's museum nestled within a 16th-century Venetian tower and enjoy some leisure time to soak in the delightful atmosphere of this quaint town.

br />Blue cave on Bisevo Island (extra expense)
Enjoy a scenic 45-minute boat ride to the picturesque island of Bisevo, situated roughly three miles from Vis. This island boasts a collection of caves that can only be reached by sea. Each day around noon, the waters become tranquil, allowing sunlight to stream into one of the caves through an underwater entrance. This phenomenon transforms the water into a shimmering silver hue and illuminates the cave's interior with a stunning blue glow, earning it the name Blue Cave. Hop aboard a local boat to access the Blue Cave through a small natural opening and immerse yourself in its extraordinary beauty.

Growing up in Hvar, a group of friends was inspired by the soothing melodies of traditional Dalmatian songs and founded Klapa Galešnik in 2002, with the intention of dedicating themselves more seriously to a cappella singing. Their debut performance took place at the Dalmatian Klapa Festival in Omiš in 2003. Since that time, their performances have consistently enriched the cultural landscape of Hvar and its surrounding regions. The group is led by Professor Tomi Domancic.

Day 13: Hvar Island (Croatia)

The heart of island paradise Hvar is the Old Town — while it's become a modern-day hotspot, it's layered in history and architectural wonder. The town of Hvar is a photogenic jumble of whitewashed buildings with sun-kissed red roofs, and beyond the town are rolling hills peppered with lavender fields, olive groves, and

br />Begin your hiking tour with a stroll through the charming old town. Pass through the main city gate, known as the Porta di Datallo (Gate of Dates), and ascend the stairs into the historical heart of the city. Here, you'll encounter 15th and 16th-century palaces and winding pathways that fill the air with the fragrant scents of Mediterranean flora. Continue your journey towards Hvar's fortress, known locally as Fortica or Španjola. Once you cross the town walls, enjoy a gentle ascent along a tree-lined hillside leading to the fortress.

originally built in the early 16th century during Venetian rule and reconstructed in 1579, this Spanish fortress now showcases an impressive collection of amphorae and artifacts from antiquity and the Middle Ages. In addition to appreciating its stunning architecture, you'll be rewarded with breathtaking panoramic views of the city of Hvar, the surrounding landscape, and the Pakleni Islands. Take some time to explore the fortress before making your way back to the ship.

Its Old Town, referred to by the locals as 'Little Dubrovnik', is a delightful collection of medieval churches, palaces, and squares, while the villages of Cara and Smokvica produce the country's signature dry white wine. You will sail to Dubrovnik later in the day. cstrong>DiscoverMOREcbr />span>A walking tour of Korcula (extra expense)br />Discover the rich historical tapestry of Korcula, Croatia's captivating island, where landmarks ranging from Marco Polo's house to medieval fortifications unfold tales of Turkish invaders and resilient pirates. combat winter winds and offer natural 'air-conditioning.' On your walking tour, traverse cobblestone streets through centuries of art and history, visiting 14th- to 16th-century fortifications, the Rector's palace, and the City Museum housed in a 16th-century mansion.
