It's often referred to as the 'Island of Colours' due to its diverse soil shades, including yellow, orange, red, and dazzling white – even more vibrant against the backdrop of turquoise waters. It's also the original home of the iconic marble statue of Venus of Milo. Unearthed in 1820, the statue is now on display at the

Louvre Museum in Paris, but Milos's archaeological museum houses a replica.

Discover the incredible volcanic island of Milos, one of the most beautiful places on earth. Starting from the harbour along the dramatic Milos coastline toward Papafranga, a cluster of deep-sea inlets and sea caves at the base of a pristine ravine which was shaped by volcanic activity. Explore Sarakiniko, an inlet of pure white stone sculpted by volcanic eruptions. This startlingly beautiful, otherworldly spot is one of the island's many geological wonders and perhaps one of the most photographed places in the Cyclades. Stroll through the village to admire its traditional architecture and its stunning view of the sea, and we'll sample some homemade sweets at a few of the village's local pastry shops. Visit the ruins of ancient Melos and its Roman amphitheatre, which is cut into the rocky slope of the hill near the ancient agora. The marble amphitheatre includes seven intact rows of seats and offers a lovely view of the bay. Stop at the site where the Venus de Milo was discovered in 1820 before strolling around the Plaka, the traditional capital of Milos. Chora, Monastery of Saint John the Theologian and the Cave of the Apocalypse

After leaving the Cave, you will drive to the historic village of Chora, perched atop a hill, where you'll have the chance to capture breathtaking panoramic views of the island and explore the stunning architecture of homes dating back to the 15th to 18th centuries. Chora, the island's capital, is home to the 11th-century Monastery of Saint John the Theologian. The Akrotiri Salt Lake and wetlands, just south of Limassol, are a haven for birdwatchers, especially in winter when flocks of flamingos congregate. </p></p><p><strong>DiscoverMORE</strong><br /><span>Paphos monuments tour (extra expense)<br />As we drive along the scenic coast road from Limassol to Paphos, our first stop is at Petra tou Romiou, the legendary birthplace of Aphrodite. This fascinating geological formation, composed of massive rocks, is located along one of the island's most stunning coastlines, in the southwestern Paphos district. According to ancient myth, the Greek Goddess of Love and Beauty, Aphrodite, was born from the sea foam at this very spot. Legend has it that she emerged from the waves and was carried on a shell to this enchanting beach. The imposing rock formations at this location are also tied to a more recent tale involving the Byzantine hero Digenis Akritas, who is said to have hurled them into the sea to protect the region from invading Saracen Arabs during the 7th to 10th centuries. The name Petra tou Romiou translates to "Rock of the Greek," in honour of this heroic figure. Continuing our journey to Paphos, we will visit the courtyard of Chrysopolitissa, which was constructed over the remains of the largest Early Christian Basilica on the island. Within the church's courtyard stands St. Paul's Pillar, where, according to tradition, the Apostle was flogged prior to converting the Roman governor, Sergius Paulus, to Christianity. Next, we will explore the Paphos Archaeological Park, home to the rich history of the town, including the magnificent villas known as the House of Dionysos, Aion, and Thyseus. The

exquisite mosaic floors of these noble residences date back to between the 3rd and 5th centuries BC and are regarded as some of the finest examples of their kind in the Eastern

Mediterranean.

Within its archaeological park lies a remarkable array of artifacts, including the meticulously restored Greco-Roman amphitheatre, which now hosts theatrical and musical performances year-round. Here, you can also explore the former Roman villa known as the House of Efstolios, where you'll find stunning rooms adorned with vibrant mosaic floors dating back to the 5th century AD. Just 3 kilometers west of Kourion, we will visit the Sanctuary of Apollo Hylatis. As the God of the Woodland, Apollo Hylates served as the protector of Kourion, and it is believed that he was worshipped at this sacred site from the 8th century BC until the 4th century AD. The sanctuary was a significant religious hub that underwent numerous expansions and modifications over the centuries. Our destination is the vibrant city of Limassol. With its picturesque Mediterranean waterfront, a wealth of cultural attractions, and captivating historical sites, Limassol is a bustling metropolis. Our excursion takes you through the charming old town, where you can admire the imposing medieval castle of Lemesos. According to history, this 14th-century fortress is the very place where Richard the Lionheart wed Berengaria of Navarre. Today, the castle houses the Cyprus Medieval Museum, showcasing exhibits of tombstones, pottery, weaponry, crosses, and silver Byzantine coins. Take your time to wander the narrow streets that connect the scenic fishing harbour to the heart of the old town.
