their albums. Recent history has dealt some unfortunate blows to the island ranging from hurricanes (Hugo in 1989) to multiple volcanic eruptions that destroyed the picturesque capital, Plymouth. In the evening, you'll cruise to St. John's on the lovely island of Antigua.
