### Day 6: Fiskádo (Greece)

Fiskardo is a delightful village in the northernmost part of the Ionian island of Kefalonia, Greece. It has a vibrant harbour encircled with cypress and olive trees, beautifully preserved Venetian architecture, and excellent local wines and seafood.

### Day 7: Itea (Greece)

The small seaside town of Itea has beautiful coastal scenery and is close to the UNESCO World Heritage site of The Delphi Sanctuary. Delphi is home to the ruins of the Temple of Apollo and is considered the centre of the world in Greek mythology.

It's time to pass through the 19th century Corinth Canal, a narrow waterway that crosses the isthmus of Corinth in Greece. From the exterior decks, watch as the ship navigates the narrow strip of water bordered by

soaring ochre-coloured cliffs.

Patmos is a small Greek island in the Aegean Sea steeped in religious history. The Monastery of Saint John the Theologian, a UNESCO World Heritage site, towers over the island's capital, Chora. Nearby you'll find the Cave of the Apocalypse, where, according to tradition, Saint John the Theologian wrote the Book of Revelation. The local cuisine of Patmos is a delightful mix of traditional Greek dishes and fresh seafood. Today choose between our Included Excursion or our EmeraldACTIVE option.

**Included Excursion**

Chora, Monastery of Saint John the Theologian and the Cave of the Apocalypse

The tour begins with a visit to the Cave of the Apocalypse, the site where the Book of Revelation, the final book of the Holy Bible, was conceived. In 95 A.D., during a time of Christian persecution, Saint John was exiled to the Island of Patmos, where he received the vision that inspired Revelation in this small cave, which has since become a revered place of worship and a significant pilgrimage destination. After leaving the Cave, you will drive to the historic village of Chora, perched atop a hill, where you'll have the chance to capture breathtaking panoramic views of the island and explore the stunning architecture of homes dating back to the 15th to 18th centuries. Chora, the island's capital, is home to the 11th-century Monastery of Saint John the Theologian. Here, you can gain insight into monastic life and immerse yourself in the rich history showcased by the magnificent ecclesiastical artifacts in its museum. The monastery boasts treasures such as frescoes depicting its founder, Christodoulou, and the miracles of St. John, along with ancient documents dating back to the 6th century, sacred vestments, silverware, and numerous icons, including a piece attributed to El Greco. From the Monastery, stroll through Chora's charming winding cobbled streets to the house of Simandiris. Here, you will enjoy a unique experience, exploring the interior of a traditional Patmian home filled with antique furniture, exquisite embroidery, and paintings collected by eight

generations of the Simandiris family.
