Itinerary

Day 1: Málaga (Spain)

Fly from the UK to Malaga. Your deluxe cruise begins in Malaga, where you'll be transferred to your Emerald Cruises luxury yacht to begin your journey of the Western Mediterranean. Flight to arrive into Malaga prior to 02:00 PM.
