Day 1: Santa Cruz de Tenerife (Spain)

Day 2: Arrecife, Lanzarote (Spain)

Spend your first day in Lanzarote and walk through the charming streets of Arrecife. The island's biggest city, Arrecife loses none of its authenticity. This beautiful port will amaze you while you wander through its streets. You might even have the chance to see the Castillo de San Gabriel. Volcano tour with wine tasting (extra expense, must be pre-booked) Experience the

awe-inspiring beauty of Timanfaya National Park, where nature's fury meets artistic splendor. Witness the surreal silence that envelopes the park, a stark contrast to the underlying activity simmering beneath the surface. Marvel at the craters and experiments showcasing the ongoing geological transformations. Venture to the enchanting Los Hervideros, a tiny inlet where the roaring surf echoes the tumultuous clash between incandescent lava and the sea. Embark on the journey back to the vessel through the breathtaking Vineyards of "La Geria." Discover the secret behind the flourishing wine production, hidden within volcanic rock walls. Savor the unique Lanzarote wine, cultivated under a protective layer of Picón that absorbs night dew and provides constant moisture to the vines.

Venture off-road past striking volcanic formations like Montaña Quemada and through the surreal terrain of La Geria's ash-covered vineyards. Witness the raw power of Timanfaya's lava fields before concluding with a stop at the Monument to the Peasant, a tribute by famed local artist César Manrique.

Tour of Rabat (extra expense)
Departing from your current location, embark on a scenic drive to Rabat, the capital city of Morocco. Rabat embodies the rich tapestry of Moroccan culture, blending ancient history with modern influences against a backdrop of amber-hued landscapes adorned with distinctive nettle trees. Upon arrival, begin your exploration with an exterior visit of the Royal Palace, a symbol of the nation's modernity and heritage. In the heart of Rabat, discover the iconic Tour Hassan, a remnant of an unfinished mosque that stands as a testament to the city's historical significance. Navigate through the labyrinthine streets of the Oudayas Kasbah, where Islamic art harmoniously coexists with the modern cityscape, creating a dazzling mosaic of cultural diversity.

Casablanca and Hassan II Mosque
Experience the vibrant city of Casablanca, a bustling metropolis and the largest port in the Maghreb. Modeled after the French city of Marseille, Casablanca boasts a rich blend of cultures and influences. Your tour begins with a visit to the iconic Hassan II Mosque, a monumental architectural marvel built to commemorate the 60th

birthday of former Moroccan King Hassan II. Marvel at its grandeur as you explore both the interior and exterior, with space for thousands of worshippers. Next, journey through the scenic seaside and residential area of Anfa en route to the historic Habous district. Here, you'll visit the esplanade of the Royal Palace and meander through the charming streets lined with colorful shops. Pause at Mohamed V Square before continuing to the bustling United Nations Square, where you'll have free time for shopping and exploration. Don't miss the opportunity to immerse yourself in the vibrant culture and bustling energy of Casablanca on this unforgettable tour.

Day 5: Gibraltar (Gibraltar)

Since the 18th century, Gibraltar is a symbol of British naval strength. Discover this fortified base and look at the famous Rock of Gibraltar. Tour of the Rock
The Rock of Gibraltar, a 1400-foot landmark, is tied to the legend of Hercules and features a British flair with its policemen and pubs. Our tour begins at the British/Spanish Frontier, leading us to Europa Point for panoramic views and photo opportunities of the Mediterranean and Atlantic convergence. We explore St. Michael's Cave's stunning formations set to classical music, spot the playful Rock Apes at King Charles "V" Wall, and pass the historic Moorish Castle before concluding the tour in the upper town area.

Hike the Mediterranean Steps
From the pier, take a short drive to the start of the Mediterranean Steps, a historic trail originally constructed by the British military during World War II. This scenic path winds along the limestone cliffs and offers opportunities to spot the Gibraltar Campion, a rare and endangered flower unique to the area. In spring, the trail also becomes a corridor for migratory birds, making it a favorite among nature enthusiasts. At the summit (1,398 feet), take in breathtaking views of the Strait of Gibraltar, Windmill Hill, Europa Point, the Great Sand Dune, the Mediterranean Sea, and the Spanish Costa del Sol. Don't forget your camera—this is a vantage point unlike any other.

Day 6: Málaga (Spain)

<p><p>Today you are in Malaga. Here you will find many impressive historic sights forming part of this beautiful city, including the Alcazaba which is one of the largest Arab fortresses in Andalusia, and Gibralfaro Castle, offering the best views over the

Tour of the charming white village of Mijas (extra expense)
Travel along the coastal road, passing Torremolinos, Benalmádena, and Fuengirola, before ascending the mountain road leading to Mijas. Mijas, renowned for its picturesque charm, unfolds at an altitude of 1,300 feet with steep, narrow streets adorned by immaculate white houses. Explore the unique Chapel of Virgen de la Peña, a small grotto church carved into the rock. Built by Mercedarian monks in 1520, it houses the image of 'Virgen de la Peña,' the village's patron saint. Pass by the bullring, visit the local Catholic church, and relish the impressive panorama from Mijas' balcony. Conclude your walking tour with a visit to the Mayan Monkey Mijas chocolate museum, where you'll delve into the history of chocolate and witness demonstrations of age-old machines still in use today. Enjoy tasting pieces of organic chocolates and a glass of wine.

Day 7: Cartagena (Spain)

<p><p>Cartagena, in the Mediterranean's Costa Cálida, was one of the most important naval ports in Spain until the 18th century. This portside town has been inhabited by several cultures who have left their mark on its heritage. From its Roman Amphitheatre to the Torre Ciega, there is no shortage of sights to amaze you here.</p></p><p>EmeraldPLUS
Spain's most noble tradition: the strikingly elegant Andalusian horses
Just a few kilometres from Cartagena, this charming ranch showcases magnificent pure Spanish-bred horses with elegant bloodlines. For over 40 years, the Conesa family has operated this ranch, where visitors can observe broodmares and foals, and witness Spanish horse training and stallion management. The experience includes snacks while watching a coordinated training by an Andalusian dancer and a stallion. Recognized as a finalist for the 2018 Seatrade Cruise Awards, this tour offers a unique glimpse into traditional ranch life and close interaction with nature and animals.

Day 8: Palma de Mallorca (Spain)

<p><p>The second largest city of the Balearic Islands, and the capital of Menorca, Mahón, is yours to explore today. Valldemossa and Son Marroig (extra expense)
Discover Valldemossa, a charming village known for its stunning landscapes. Guided by an expert, explore the Carthusian Monastery, a historic site where composer Chopin and writer George Sand stayed in 1838. Visit its museum featuring original Chopin sheets and Sand's

manuscripts. Enjoy a mini piano concert at the nearby King Sancho Palace, followed by free time to stroll through vibrant streets, savor local treats like Coca de patata and frozen almond milk, and shop for souvenirs. Finally, admire breathtaking views from the ancient residence of Archduke Luis Salvador at Son Marroig before returning to the port.

Day 9: Mahón, Menorca (Spain)

Discover the beautiful island of Menorca, starting in Ciutadella with its charming houses and traditional architecture. Travel to Mahón, home to the world's largest natural port. Stop at the picturesque fishing village of Fornells for photo opportunities. Visit Monte Toro for breathtaking views and the Monte Toro Virgin Chapel. Explore Subaida cheese farm and vineyard, enjoying tastings of their products. If time allows, sample local gin in Mahón before taking a guided walk through the town and returning to your ship.

Day 10: Bonifacio, Corsica (France)

Begin your Bonifacio adventure with a mini train ride through the Bosco quarter, featuring St. Francis convent and a mariners' cemetery. Enjoy panoramic views of Sardinia before visiting the Corsican Gothic St. Dominique church, likely built by the Templars in 1270. Stroll through narrow streets, past the 14th-century St. Marie Majeure church, and explore historical sites like Two Emperors Street and Place des Armes. Savor local delicacies and Corsican wine at a wine bar.

Coastal boat trip (extra expense)

Join an exclusive coastal exploration starting from the pier aboard a comfortable boat. Sail through Bonifacio's narrow channel and pass the historic "Madonetta" lighthouse. Be amazed by the Sdragnato marine cave, featuring a natural skylight that highlights Corsica's silhouette. Glide by "Fazio Creek," spotting landmarks like the "Rudder of Corsica" and the legendary King of Aragon's staircase, built for practical water transport in 1420. The excursion concludes at the iconic "Grain of Sand" rock, a stunning erosion-sculpted formation perfect for

memorable photos.
