Day 1: Málaga (Spain)

Day 2: Almería (Spain)

Walking tour of Cartagena and Roman Theatre (extra expense)
Embark on a captivating walking tour from the pier, following the sea wall to Town Hall Square and the main avenue. Admire modernist buildings from the early 20th century. Cartagena's strategic location has attracted settlers since its Carthaginian roots in the 3rd century BC, later becoming a crucial naval base in the 18th century. Visit the Roman Theatre, built between the 5th and 1st centuries BC, which could hold 6,000 spectators. Explore the Old Quarter, featuring "Modernist" townhouses from the late 19th to early 20th century, reflecting the city's prosperous mining boom.

Day 4: Alicante (Spain)

Alicante has a lovely Mediterranean climate, with hot summers and mild winters, making it a popular holiday destination year-round. Alicante offers a vibrant holiday atmosphere and rich history, making it an appealing destination.
