Day 1: Valletta (Malta)

Day 2: Mgarr, Gozo (Malta)

Your first stop is Mgarr, a small Maltese village known for its picturesque countryside and agricultural landscape, with abundant vineyards and olive groves scattered throughout the area. The village has a quaint and traditional feel, with charming old stone houses and winding cobbled streets and offers a unique and authentic Maltese experience. Today choose between our

Walk to Ramla Bay
Set off on foot from the quay in Mgarr and discover the tranquil beauty of Gozo's countryside during a scenic 30-minute guided walk. Your route winds through rustic landscapes and peaceful farmland, leading you to Ramla I-Hamra—Gozo's famed red-sand beach. Weather permitting, enjoy time to swim, relax, or simply take in the stunning coastal views before returning to the port refreshed and recharged.

Culinary and artistic Gozo (extra expense, must be pre-booked)
Visit craft workshops and galleries to experience Gozo's rich artisanal traditions. See local delicacies made by hand, from infused oils and vinegars to sun-dried figs and jams. Explore Fontana Cottage to witness wool spinning, weaving, and delicate lacemaking ("Bizzilla"), with unique handcrafted souvenirs available. End at a private sculpture gallery to meet a local artist, admire Neolithic-style limestone works, and relax in the garden with a local snack and Maltese soft drink.

Day 3: Porto Empedocle (Italy)

<p><p>Located on the southern coast of Sicily, Porto Empedocle is a charming port town, named after the ancient Greek philosopher, Empedocles, who, as local legend attests, was born in the area. Here, you'll discover a picturesque town with a lively waterfront area filled with fishing boats and yachts and a reputation for the freshest seafood and traditional Sicilian cuisine. Porto Empedocle also makes a convenient base for exploring the surrounding area, including the striking Scala dei Turchi cliffs and historic sites of Agrigento.</p></p><p>DiscoverMORE
The Valley of the Temples in Agrigento (extra expense)
Travel back 2,500 years as you explore one of Sicily's most breathtaking archaeological sites—the Valley of the Temples in Agrigento. From Porto Empedocle, travel by coach to this UNESCO World Heritage Site, where your guide will lead you through ancient ruins surrounded by olive and almond trees. Marvel at the grandeur of temples dedicated to Zeus, Hera, Hercules, and more, with highlights including the remarkably preserved Temple of Concordia. Conclude your visit with a stop at the Archaeological Museum before returning to port, enriched by history and spectacular views.

Day 4: Mazara del Vallo (Italy)

Its historic center, the Casbah, reflects a rich Arab-Norman heritage, with winding streets once home to scholars, merchants, and judges. Discover the town's vibrant

Walking tour of Mazara del Vallo (extra expense)
Step into the rich cultural tapestry of Mazara del Vallo, a city shaped by Arab, Norman, and Mediterranean influences. Begin with a guided walk through its historic center, where narrow alleyways reveal a blend of Islamic and Baroque architecture. Visit the Church of Sant'Egidio to see the famed Dancing Satyr—a remarkable Hellenistic bronze statue pulled from the depths of the sea. Then, continue to a local winery, nestled within a coastal nature reserve. Enjoy a curated tasting of local wines paired with Sicilian bites, while taking in views of vineyards stretching toward the Mediterranean.

Day 5: La Goulette (Tunisia)

This lively port district is celebrated for its waterfront promenade, renowned seafood restaurants, and multicultural heritage reflected in its streets and architecture. You will be drawn by the coastal atmosphere, sea views, and relaxed rhythm of daily life.</p></p><p>Included Excursion
Medina and guided visit of the village of Sidi Bou Said
Immerse yourself in Tunisia's vibrant culture with a guided tour through two of its most iconic destinations. Begin in the historic Medina of Tunis, a UNESCO World Heritage Site teeming with narrow alleyways, colorful markets, and centuries-old architecture. Enjoy guided exploration followed by free time to browse local shops. Then, continue to the postcard-perfect village of Sidi Bou Said, perched above the Bay of Tunis. Stroll its cobbled streets lined with whitewashed walls and vivid blue accents and soak up the atmosphere.

Carthage tour (extra expense)
Begin with a scenic drive to the impressive Ruins of Carthage, where legend tells that the Phoenicians founded the city in 800 BC and from where the great general Hannibal set out on his epic journey. Carthage later fell to the Romans in 146 BC, only to be refounded by Julius Caesar and eventually rise as the Empire's second largest city outside Rome. As you explore these extensive archaeological remains, discover the grandeur of the Baths of Antonius Pius, one of the most remarkable Roman bath complexes in North Africa, and visit the ancient amphitheatre where public spectacles once captivated thousands. Wander through the historic Punic ports, a testament to Carthage's maritime power, and admire the weather-washed walls and elegant curved window grills characteristic of the region. Discover the vast cisterns that supplied the city with essential water reserves, and Byrsa Hill, where sweeping views accompany stories of Hannibal, Dido, and Carthage's enduring legacy. This immersive tour invites you to connect with history in a setting where every ruin has a tale to tell.

Day 6: Trapani, Sicily (Italy)

The city centre is characterised by narrow winding streets, baroque architecture, and lively markets selling fresh seafood and local produce. Marsala, salt panes and wine tasting (extra expense)

The unique climatic conditions, including high temperatures and winds, contribute to the mesmerizing landscape of the salt flats. Continue your journey to downtown Marsala, a charming town situated on Cape Boeo, known as the ancient Lilybaeum. Rich in Carthaginian, Roman, Norman, Arab, and Spanish influences, Marsala offers a delightful walking tour where you can admire the exterior of the Cathedral, built upon a pre-existing Norman castle. Enjoy some leisure time in Marsala before proceeding to one of the world-renowned wineries. Here, indulge in a wine tasting experience.

Day 7: Palermo (Italy)

Volcano island tour by boat (extra expense)
Experience the captivating wonders of Vulcano Island on this thrilling excursion departing from Lipari's Marina Corta. Meet your guide and board a private motorboat for a scenic journey across the Aeolian archipelago. As you sail towards Vulcano, marvel at the island's volcanic landscape, characterized by its three distinct peaks. Upon arrival, disembark at the pier and set out on foot to explore the island's natural wonders. Take some free time to wander through the charming streets of the village, filled with quaint shops and cafes. Cap off your visit with a delicious tasting of a traditional Sicilian cannolo at the famed Caffè Sicilia before enjoying free time to explore or shop.

Stroll through Cathedral Square and admire the stunning Arethusa Fountain overlooking the bay.
