#### Day 4: Capri (Italy)

An island in Italy's Bay of Naples, Capri is synonymous with stunning natural beauty. ### Day 6: Valletta (Malta)

Next, travel to Zurrieg for a slow drive past the iconic Blue Grotto, offering mesmerizing views of the vivid blue waters, dramatic sea caves, and the remote Filfla Island, a protected seabird sanctuary. Continue through Malta's rural countryside to a local winery, where you'll be welcomed by the vintners for a guided introduction to Maltese winemaking. Enjoy a tasting of local wines paired with a traditional Maltese platter, highlighting the island's rich culinary heritage. From there, head to the coast for a photo stop overlooking St. Paul's Islands, where, according to tradition, the Apostle Paul was shipwrecked in 60 AD—an event that marked the beginning of Christianity in Malta.
