Day 1: Amsterdam (Netherlands)

Welcome to the Netherlands. Upon arrival, you'll be met at the airport by a member of our friendly greetings team and then transferred to your contemporary Emerald Star-Ship. This evening, meet your fellow guests and enjoy your first dinner on board.

Day 2: Amsterdam (Netherlands)

From the celebrated Zaanse Schans, where artisan workshops and working mills evoke the Dutch Golden Age, to charming towns like Alkmaar, famed for its historic cheese-making traditions, discover how the Dutch have shaped their landscape for generations.

Your first stop is the nearby neighbourhood of Zaanse Schans, a picturesque open-museum and recreation of a traditional Dutch village from the 18th century. Stroll among the quintessential windmills and wooden houses reflected in canals and artisan workshops, then learn how this historically significant village helped power the Netherlands' transformation into an industrial leader.

From cheese-making and wooden clog-carving to early manufacturing innovations, Zaanse Schans village presents a unique blend of traditional heritage and progress. Your guided morning tour offers a fascinating perspective on Dutch culture – past, present, and future – from the old sailboats exhibited at the museum and preservation methods to the historic windmills used in various industries.

Alkmaar cheese market & tasting (extra expense)
Step outside of Amsterdam to visit the charming town of Alkmaar. It is a must-visit destination for travellers seeking an authentic Dutch experience where you can discover rich history, vibrant culture, and picturesque landscapes. Explore its historic cheese market, which has been a city tradition since 1365. Cheese is a significant trade product of the city of Alkmaar, and you will learn more about it on your visit today.

Day 3: Veere (Netherlands)

Veere is a storybook harbour town on the Veerse Meer, where cobbled lanes and gabled merchants' houses gather around a tranquil marina. Once a bustling trading port, it now feels quietly exclusive, with historic quaysides, boutique shops, and waterside cafés framed by the graceful tower of the Grote Kerk.

Guided tour of the Delta Works
Today, your included tour takes you to the world-famous Delta Works: a modern marvel derived from centuries of resilience, and a prime example of how the Dutch have mastered their eternal battle with the sea. With its impressive system of dams, sluices and barriers to ensure the land is protected from the encroaching waters, the Delta Works ranks as one of the most ambitious flood defence projects ever built.

This guided tour offers a marvellous opportunity to learn about the history of water management pioneered by the Dutch, from windmill-powered drainage to cutting-edge engineering that protects millions today and how necessity has shaped change and development.

Once a thriving trading hub with its network of canals and vital connections to other ports, Dordrecht's affluence originates from its formidable maritime past. During your canal tour of Dordrecht, explore the winding waterways and tranquil quays, admiring the historic warehouses and gabled houses that evoke tales of maritime power and prosperity.

Visit the world's first floating farm in Rotterdam, anchored in the Merwehaven Harbour. Established as recently as 2019, the Floating Farm Rotterdam is no mere dairy farm, but a pioneering vision of urban food resilience and a model of smart design, climate adaptive living and sustainable agriculture.

On this fascinating included tour, learn about the floating farm's circular food system and eco-technology in action, along with the water-resilient build and open design. Currently, there are around 40 resident cows who produce up to 320,000 litres (84,535 gallons) of milk annually and dairy products, such as yoghurt, cheese and butter, all processed on site.

Visit to Paleis Het Loo (extra expense)

In the afternoon, you can join an optional DiscoverMORE excursion to Paleis Het Loo, the Netherlands' Royal Palace for three centuries, which nowadays serves as a museum. The palace and the exquisite gardens are a must-see masterpiece of 17th-century Dutch Baroque style.

Day 6: Rotterdam (Netherlands)

The Hague is a refined coastal city where grand avenues, royal residences, and elegant squares meet long, sandy North Sea beaches. Tree-lined parks, shady boulevards, and peaceful woodlands soften the urban landscape, giving the city a relaxed, livable feel. Historic landmarks such as the Binnenhof parliament complex sit alongside world-class museums and contemporary districts, creating a sophisticated atmosphere that feels distinctly different from nearby Rotterdam.

Today, your included morning tour uncovers a surprising side to The Hague. Besides its world-wide status as the seat of the Dutch government and UN International Court of Justice, The Hague is also renowned as one of the Netherlands' greenest cities, home to green parks, forests and a beautiful coastline.

The Hague has a growing reputation for its progressive urban lifestyle that extends to eco-friendly roofs, energy-efficient buildings and one of Europe's most extensive bicycle path networks. Residents who live in this 'green city by the sea' enjoy a high quality of life with clean air and smart urban design, especially as The Hague is actively working towards a climate-neutral future – part of the European mission '100 Climate Neutral and Smart Cities by 2030.'

Royal Delft has been producing the renowned Delft blue pottery since 1653 and stands as the only remaining 17th century Delft pottery factory. Here, local master painters still decorate the exquisite pieces in the traditional manner – which dates back to the 1500s. Enjoy a guided tour of the factory, including a visit to the showroom and an inspiring painting demonstration.
