Itinerary

Day 1: Amsterdam (Netherlands)

Welcome to Amsterdam, a postcard-worthy destination of picturesque canals, cafés and art galleries. Here, you'll be met at the airport by your friendly Emerald Cruises representative and transferred to your contemporary Emerald Star-Ship. Your friendly captain and crew will welcome you on board. With a late departure tonight, you can go ashore and explore Amsterdam after dark.

Day 2: Rotterdam (Netherlands)

The second-largest city in the Netherlands and the busiest port in Europe, Rotterdam is a modern multicultural hub. Its historic centre was largely destroyed by German bombing in World War II, and the subsequent reconstruction efforts utilised a patchwork of architectural styles, forever altering the city's skyline. It is home to the tallest commercial and residential buildings in

the country, a visual symbol of Rotterdam's spirit of innovation.

Walking tour of Rotterdam
Explore the dynamic city of Rotterdam on a guided walking tour that showcases its cutting-edge architecture and rich maritime history. From the striking Cube Houses to the iconic Erasmus Bridge, you'll discover how Rotterdam's post-war reconstruction transformed it into a hub of innovation and design.

After lunch, cruise to Dordrecht. One of the oldest cities in the Netherlands, it dates back to the 13th century and is filled with many beautiful historic buildings.

Welcome to Nijmegen, the Roman settlement of Noviomagus and the oldest town in the Netherlands. Though its history stretches back more than 2,000 years, it also has a youthful vibe thanks to its large university, as well as beautiful scenery, lush green spaces and world-class museums.

Join a walking tour through the town centre, exploring its architectural wonders, rich history and charming streets. From Roman relics to medieval architecture, you'll explore the city's landmarks, including the Valkhof Park and St. Stephen's Church, while learning about Nijmegen's fascinating past.

Step into the rich history of Bonn on a guided tour that takes you through the city's most iconic landmarks. From the stunning Beethoven House – birthplace of the legendary composer – to the impressive Poppelsdorf Palace, and Bonn Minster, known for its Romanesque architecture with Gothic elements, you'll explore the blend of history, culture, and art that defines this charming city.

With more than 300km (186 miles) of cycling trails, Bonn is one of the most bike-friendly cities in Germany. Explore the city on two wheels with this active guided e-bike tour, soaking in the authentic atmosphere and mixing with the locals.

Day 5: Bernkastel-Kues (Germany)

Dating back to 3000 BC, Bernkastel is set on the banks of the Moselle River. Its well-preserved medieval centre is home to many buildings dating back to the 15th century, creating a charming fairytale ambience. The town is surrounded by steeply terraced vineyards, producing exceptional mineral-driven white wines, most notably its world-famous Riesling.

Embark on a delightful hike through the lush vineyards of the Moselle Valley, where rolling hills and picturesque landscapes meet award-winning wine production. Afterwards, sample local wines while soaking in the stunning views of the river and surrounding vineyards.

Get a different perspective on the region with an active hike to the ruins of Landshut Castle. The 13th-century ruins are set high on a hill overlooking Bernkastel and the Moselle River, accessed by a step path through a verdant forest. Day 6: Cochem (Germany)

Spend the day in the picturesque medieval town of Cochem, known for its half-timbered houses, colourful squares and the striking Reichsburg Castle, which stands high above the town. It's in the heart of the Moselle wine region, and the town is surrounded by terraced vineyards, producing Germany's signature white varieties.

Explore the enchanting town of Cochem during a guided tour of its well-preserved sites. You'll see the remains of the historic town wall with its old fortifications, alongside the town hall and its many other gems.

Set off on a guided e-bike tour of Cochem and the surrounding region. Following a flat path beside the Moselle River, you'll take in beautiful scenery, pass lush vineyards and pass through picturesque villages.

Later, arrive in Koblenz. Once a Roman stronghold, it was established around 8 BC for its strategic value. Today, it's a modern park- and flower-filled city with a unique blend of historic and contemporary architecture.

Day 7: Sankt Goar (Germany)

Continue along the Rhine today, stopping at Sankt Goar, a quintessentially German town in the Upper Middle Rhine Valley. It is directly opposite the famed Lorelei Rock, an imposing cliff that is tied to German legends, and the ruins of Rheinfels Castle look out over the town.

Morning hike with Activity Manager Join your Activity Manager for a refreshing morning hike through the picturesque town of Sankt Goar and its stunning surroundings. This invigorating walk is the perfect way to start your day and connect with the stunning landscape of the Rhine Valley.

Later, dock in Rüdesheim, a captivating city known for its authentic atmosphere and traditional appeal. Here, in the home of cuckoo clocks, oompah bands, and Bavarian beer, the Rhineland's charm is found around every corner. Rüdesheim is also at the heart of the Rhine wine region, which is famous for its Riesling and Pinot Noir grapes.

Visit and wine tasting at Schloss Johannisberg
Set in the breathtaking Rheingau region, the legendary Schloss Johannisberg is steeped in history, cultivating exquisite wine for over 1,000 years. Set over 50 hectares in front of the Taunus mountains, it was the first Riesling winery in the world and produces wooden barrels from its onsite 300-acre forest of native oak. On this exclusive tour, you'll learn about its unique wine culture and fabled history.

Hike to Niederwalddenkmal Monument
Enjoy an active hike through verdant vineyards to the Niederwalddenkmal, a stunning monument located in the Niederwald, near Rüdesheim am Rhein, in the German state of Hesse. This historical landmark overlooks the stunning Rhine Valley and was built in the late 1800s to commemorate the Unification of Germany.

On your return to the charming town of Rüdesheim, take a short ride on the mini train to taste the specialty coffee in the region. A swig of Rüdesheimer coffee is a treat for wine-lovers and coffee-fans alike.

Day 8: Mainz (Germany)

Arrive in Mainz today, the capital of Rhineland-Palatinate. It's a captivating blend of history and modernity, with everything from Roman ruins and Baroque churches to innovative architecture. Mainz is known for its vibrant cultural scene, from museums and theatre to fun festivals and outdoor concerts. The town is famous as the birthplace of Johannes Gutenberg, who invented the first printing press and manufactured his first books in the 15th century, including the Gutenberg Bible.

Guided Tour of Mainz
Join a guided tour of Mainz and visit the impressive sandstone cathedral of the tremendous Old Town with medieval market squares and half-timbered houses. You'll also learn more about its most notable resident, Gutenberg.

Visit to Eberbach Abbey & wine tasting (extra expense)
Founded in 1136 by St. Bernard of Clairvaux, Eberbach Abbey is one of the best-preserved medieval monasteries in the Rheingau and is home to the largest medieval vineyard in Germany. During your visit, you can indulge in the local Riesling wine tasting, experiencing the vibrant flavours of the region. Please note, this activity runs at the same time as the included tour.
Activity level: Easy, Duration: 3 hours

Arrives On: 28 Mar 28

Day 9: Strasbourg (France)

This morning, you will discover Strasbourg, the medieval capital of France's Alsace Region. Set on the border between France and Germany, the city is a unique blend of cultures, which can be seen in its architecture, language and food. The World Heritage-listed centre is threaded with beautiful canals lined with traditional buildings and the breathtaking Strasbourg Cathedral, which stood as the tallest building in the world for more than 220 years.

Hidden treasures of Strasbourg
Discover the city's charm on a walking tour through Petite France, featuring storybook canals, half-timbered houses, and the covered bridges. See the Vauban Dam and the World Heritage-listed Neustadt quarter, home to Strasbourg's administrative buildings. Afterwards, enjoy some free time to explore the city at your own pace.

Alsatian Wine Route (extra expense)
Join an immersive excursion through the Alsatian region where you will get to taste some of the best regional wines and learn more about the area's long tradition of winemaking.

Day 10: Breisach (Germany)

Perched high above the Rhine River and surrounding vineyards, Breisach is where Germany's Black Forest spills into the lush Alsace region. It's another town with influences from both cultures, as well as a strong passion for wine. It centres around the hilltop St Stephen's Cathedral, an impressive Romanesque-Gothic structure that dominates the skyline and can be seen from a great distance.

Spend a magical morning in nearby Colmar, on the French side just across the border. As you walk down the cobblestone lanes, it's easy to imagine the characters from the Grimm's Fairy Tales here, with half-timbered façades adorned with window boxes full of colourful blooms.

Travel upstream to Steinensadt and board a canoe to paddle along the quiet waters of the Upper Rhine. You'll get a new perspective on this famed waterway, taking in local plant and animal life as you are immersed in beautiful natural surroundings.

Day 11: Basel (Switzerland)

Your journey concludes this morning in Basel (Huningue). After breakfast, it's time to say farewell to your fellow guests. Disembark your Emerald Star-Ship for your transfer to the airport and take with you memories of the beautiful Moselle with its vineyards and the castles on the legendary Rhine.
