Day 3: Nijmegen (Netherlands)

Located on the Waal River in Gelderland near the German border, Nijmegen is the oldest city in The Netherlands, with a history spanning over 2,000 years, dating back to Roman times. As a vibrant city of nearly 200,000 residents, it offers a blend of ancient history, verdant green spaces and a lively student atmosphere driven by Radboud University.

Day 4: Bonn (Germany)

Today you'll arrive in Bonn, a historic city set along the Rhine River. Founded as a Roman settlement in the 1st century B.C., Bonn has served as the residence of the Archbishops of Cologne and later as the West German capital. Nowadays, this is a vibrant, international United Nations city and a secondary federal hub. The world-renowned composer Ludwig van Beethoven was born here in 1770, and his former home has been transformed into a major museum.

Founded around 3,000 BC, the charming town of Bernkastel rests along the banks of the Moselle River and is home to beautifully preserved buildings that date back to 1416 A.D., including a historic medieval Old Town. Nestled in the Moselle wine region, Bernkastel is another major centre for wine production, especially Riesling and is also well-known as a health resort and birthplace of the philosopher, Nikolaus von Kues.

Famous for the imposing remains of Rheinfels Castle, rolling vineyards, and its proximity to the legendary Lorelei Rock, it offers a quintessential 'Romantic Rhine' experience with traditional, half-timbered buildings and idyllic riverine views.

In the afternoon, you'll arrive in Rudesheim, a delightful small town and gateway to storied German wine

culture and Rhine Valley history. A blend of medieval architecture and a lively, tourist-oriented atmosphere, Rudesheim is celebrated for its fine wines, especially Riesling and Sekt (sparkling wine). Wine-making traditions here date back over

Day 8: Mainz (Germany)

Welcome to Mainz, a city located at the confluence of the Rhine and Main rivers, offering a host of impressive locations. As well as the stunning Old Town, Mainz is best known as the birthplace of Johannes Gutenberg, who invented the first printing press and manufactured his first books in the 15th century, including the Gutenberg Bible. This revolutionised the way books were produced in this period.

Guided tour of Mainz
During your guided city tour, explore the Old Town to admire the sandstone cathedral, medieval market squares and well-preserved, half-timbered houses. From your guide, you can also learn more about this city where Johannes Gutenberg, the inventor of the printing press over 600 years ago, was born. **DiscoverMORE**

Visit to Eberbach Abbey (extra expense)
Visit Eberbach Abbey, one of the best-

preserved medieval monasteries in the Rheingau Region. Founded in 1136 by St. Bernard of Clairvaux, it was once one of the most active monasteries in Germany, boasting the largest medieval vineyard in the country. As a major filming location for the 1986 film 'In the Name of the Rose', adapted from Umberto Eco's thrilling novel of the same name, Eberbach is a must-see. Today, the abbey continues its winemaking tradition, producing exquisite wines. During your visit, you'll have the opportunity to indulge in a Riesling wine tasting, experiencing the vibrant flavours of the region. Please note, this tour operates at the same time as your included tour.

Day 9: Strasbourg (France)

Today, you'll arrive in Strasbourg, a city that promises much in the way of beautiful architecture. The World Heritage-listed Neustadt district is an iconic example of 19th century German Imperial architecture. Strasbourg is also at the heart of the celebrated Alsace wine region.
