Day 1: Amsterdam (Netherlands)

Welcome to The Netherlands and Amsterdam, the Dutch capital and a postcard-worthy destination known for its network of World Heritage-listed canals, cafés, and esteemed art galleries. Upon arrival, you'll be met at the airport by your friendly Emerald Cruises representative and transferred to your contemporary Emerald Star-Ship for the start of a memorable voyage.

Day 2: Amsterdam (Netherlands)

Beyond Amsterdam's storied canals, a gentler rhythm unfolds as you venture into the Dutch countryside, where emerald-green pastures, mirror-like waterways and centuries-old windmills paint an impossibly picturesque scene. From charming towns like Alkmaar, famed for its historic cheese-making traditions, to Waterland, where pretty, stilted villages, glassy lakes and narrow

canals offer a glimpse into traditional Dutch life, discover how the Dutch have shaped their landscape for generations.

Day 3: Düsseldorf (Germany)

This morning, you'll cross the German border and arrive in the vibrant city of Düsseldorf. With its innovative architecture, high-end art scene and passion for fashion, this is one of the country's most captivating cities. After lunch, continue along the Rhine River to Cologne. Founded by the Romans in 50 AD, Cologne is one of the oldest cities in Germany and was almost completely rebuilt after the destruction during World War II. Look out for the twin spires of its Gothic cathedral, known locally as the Kolner Dom.

Discover the vibrant city of Düsseldorf on a guided walking tour that takes you through its cultural landmarks and lively streets. During your tour, explore the historic Altstadt and modern cityscape.

Guided tour of Cologne's Old Town
Join your local guide and explore the city of Cologne, including the Old Town with its beautiful squares, historic monuments and contemporary architecture. You will conclude at the World Heritage-listed Cologne Cathedral, whose filigree twin towers form an iconic part of the skyline. During your free time, shop for trinkets or explore further before returning to your Emerald Star-Ship.

Day 4: Koblenz (Germany)

Once a Roman stronghold, Koblenz was established around 8 BC for its strategic value. Today, it's a modern park- and flower-filled city with a unique blend of historic and contemporary architecture. Later, you'll cruise through the World Heritage-listed Rhine Gorge, exemplifying the extraordinary beauty of an area that left philosophers and artists of the German Romanticism movement entranced. Look out for the iconic Lorelei Rock, where a beautiful siren is said to have lured sailors to their death with her song.

Orientation walk of Koblenz
Join your local guide for an insightful walking tour of Koblenz, passing examples of architecture that survived the war years, including the Church of Our Lady. You'll also have the chance to see the point at which two of Europe's great rivers merge at the German Corner.

Moselle Valley & Cochem Castle visit (extra expense)
Resting on a spectacular hill 91m (299 ft) above the Moselle Valley, you'll find the medieval town of Cochem. Embark on a walking tour including a guided visit to the magnificent Cochem (Reichsburg) Castle, boasting impressive views of the Moselle Valley. The original 12th-century Romanesque style was replaced by King Louis XIV, who ordered his troops to destroy it in 1689. Rebuilt in 1868, he chose the neo-Gothic architecture that we know today as his family's summer residence.

Activity level: Difficult/Active, Duration: 5 hours

Day 5: Mannheim (Germany)

A lively university town, Mannheim is best known for its unique grid system and is often called the 'City of Squares' (Quadratstadt). Its most famous landmark is arguably the striking Baroque Mannheim Palace, one of the largest palaces in Europe.

Cruise onwards to Germersheim tonight for an exclusive concert at Bruchsal Palace.

Guided tour of Heidelberg
Travel to nearby Heidelberg, an idyllic UNESCO City of Literature that has inspired the likes of Mark Twain and famed British artist William Turner. A guided tour of the town will unveil its rich history, starting at the Renaissance remnants of Heidelberg Castle, where carefully curated gardens are still peppered

with serene water features, sculptures and colourful flowerbeds.

Meet your local guide and take the funicular to the peak of Mount Königstuhl. Take in the breathtaking panoramic views of the Neckar Valley, then continue your journey on foot through the forest. Once out of the woods, enter Heidelberg Castle for a short tour of the castle remnants, before descending into the Old Town. Enjoy a brief orientation walk and some free time at leisure.

This evening, you're invited to attend a private classical concert in one of the most beautiful rooms. Set high above the Rhine at the point where the Black Forest joins Alsace, Breisach presents a charming blend of German and French cultures. The Romanesque-Gothic St. Stephen's church, resting on a volcanic hill, is visible from a great distance and is a notable landmark.

Lyon is arguably most famous for its outstanding cuisine and culinary heritage, considered the heart of gastronomy in France and one of the world's

premier food capitals. Home to traditional Lyonnaise cuisine, you'll have plenty of opportunity to sample an array of exceptional culinary delights, accompanied by some of Europe's finest wines.

Guided tour of Lyon with cheese tasting
Discover the gastronomic heart of France on a flavourful journey through Lyon. Wander through the city's charming streets with a local expert and explore the traditions and specialties that shaped its renowned culinary culture. The highlight of today's tour is a guided visit to the incredible Les Halles de Lyon – Paul Bocuse, an iconic city market showcasing the excellence of French cuisine. Meet dedicated artisans, observe their craft, and learn the stories behind Lyon's celebrated gastronomic heritage. You'll also enjoy a tasting of some of the region's outstanding artisan cheeses—a rich, immersive culinary experience for food lovers.

A lovely place to relax with a drink, you'll soon understand why this picturesque location has been used as the backdrop for numerous films, including the French classic, 'The Three Musketeers.'

Nestled in the heart of Burgundy, the Beaujolais region is well-known for its distinctive wines produced here, particularly the world-famous Beaujolais Nouveau. The Beaujolais wine region is renowned for its vibrant, fruity wines produced with the Gamay grape variety. The extensive planting of Gamay grapes makes Beaujolais one of several regions across the world that focus solely on a single grape variety. Red wine accounts for 99 percent of the total wine production in the Beaujolais wine region.

Journey through the rolling hills and charming villages of the Beaujolais region, a landscape shaped by centuries of winemaking traditions. Day 13: Avignon (France)

Set along the banks of the Rhône River in the celebrated region of Provence, the fortified city of Avignon bears a rich and illustrious history – from Celtic beginnings to the residence of seven successive Popes between 1309 and 1377. This legacy is evident today in the massive Palais des Papes (Popes' Palace), which is surrounded by medieval stone ramparts and an assortment of grand palaces and courtyards. Avignon also played a significant role in the nation-defining French Revolution during the late 18th century.

Discover the charm of Avignon on a guided walk through its historic streets, from medieval ramparts to lively local

Learn about regional traditions, daily life, and the city's rich heritage as your guide brings Avignon's stories to life. Enjoy a delightful immersion in the culture and evocative atmosphere at the heart of Provence.

Later, it was used as a toll gate before transforming into a road bridge. On this fascinating guided tour, you'll also visit the small Roman town of Uzès. Explore the circular streets that once protected the medieval castle and sample some of the region's delicious cuisine in the local restaurants.

Visit the 2,000-year-old Arles Amphitheatre and follow in the footsteps of world-renowned artist, Vincent van Gogh; some of his legendary artwork was inspired by the dazzling beauty of the surrounding area.

Compact and brimming with shops and restaurants, the village retains a traditional lifestyle while being regarded as an outstanding attraction. The high, rocky pinnacle of Château-Fortress des Baux extends to the southwest of the village and reveals incredible views from the hilltop.

Day 15: Arles (France)

After breakfast, it's time to bid farewell to your fellow guests and disembark your Star-Ship for your transfer to the airport, taking memories of the idyllic French countryside, exceptional gastronomic and world-famous wines.
