Day 1: Budapest (Hungary)

Welcome to Budapest, Eastern Europe's liveliest and most cosmopolitan city. The Hungarian capital is divided by the iconic Danube River, with Buda and Pest connected by the famous Chain Bridge. Here, you'll be met at the airport and transferred to the comfortable surrounds of your Emerald Star-Ship. This evening, join your fellow guests for a dinner on board.

Day 2: Budapest (Hungary)

Pass by the botanical gardens of the Episcopal Summer Palace, the Old Town Hall and its delightful Renaissance courtyard and the Slovak National Theatre, where busts of famous composers adorn the façade.

Day 4: Vienna (Austria)

Guided tour of Vienna
Explore the famous sights of the Ringstrasse and Vienna's city centre by coach and on foot. Marvel at the Renaissance-style arches that adorn the façades of the Opera House, the Baroque Burgtheater and the Flemish Gothic Parliament before enjoying time to explore Vienna at leisure.

Schönbrunn Palace, the former summer residence of the Habsburg Empire, is considered one of the most beautiful Baroque palaces in Europe. Today, it is a recognised World Heritage site for its historic importance, unique grounds and splendid furnishings. Follow a local expert to hear the fascinating tales of the intriguing former residents.

Viennese evening concert (extra expense)
With Mozart, Beethoven, Strauss and Schubert among its historical repertoire, Vienna is the world capital of opera and classical music. Enjoy an exclusive evening concert at one of Vienna's most beautiful concert halls, with favourites such as the 'Blue Danube Waltz' and the 'Radetzky March'. A complimentary glass of sparkling wine on arrival adds to the unforgettable occasion.

Day 5: Melk (Austria)

Today, cruise through the UNESCO World Heritage-listed Wachau Valley, Austria's premier wine-growing region, en route to Melk. This charming and compact town is filled with flower-lined laneways, colourful buildings, and sprawling green spaces. Later, continue to Dürnstein, one of the most enchanting villages in the Wachau wine region.

Tour of Melk Abbey
Explore this ancient abbey today on an included tour. Your guide will take you through a series of opulent rooms, each adorned with the finest Italian Baroque architecture and ornate gold leaf walls, including the ancient monastic library, renowned for its extensive collection of medieval manuscripts.

Arrives On: 26 Feb 27

Day 6: Passau (Germany)

This morning is yours to enjoy at leisure before exploring Passau in the afternoon on a guided tour. Alternatively, you may choose an optional DiscoverMORE excursion. Passau is a picturesque city shaped by the surrounding rivers over the years, sitting at the confluence of the Danube, Inn and Ilz. Cobblestone streets, graceful arcades and romantic lanes welcome you here.

Day 7: Regensburg (Germany)

This morning, cruise the Danube to Regensburg, one of Germany's best-preserved medieval cities, with two millennia of history and a relaxed, youthful atmosphere thanks to its university.

Guided tour of Regensburg
Set out on foot to discover the highlights of Regensburg. Wander the streets with your guide, as the romantic narrow alleys of the World Heritage-listed Old Town and 13th-century Town Hall invite you to live through the city's history. The highlight of your tour will be the 12th-century Stone Bridge, a medieval structure crossing the Danube. Enjoy time to explore Regensburg at leisure.

Day 8: Nuremberg (Germany)

Day 9: Bamberg (Germany)

Day 10: Würzburg (Germany)

<p><p>Known as the 'Pearl of the Romantic Road', Würzburg is the wine capital of Franconia, a position it has held since the Middle Ages. Situated on the Main River, this Franconian city is celebrated for its stunning architecture, vibrant culture and historical significance.

</p><p>Included Excursion: Walking tour of Würzburg and a visit to the Bishop's Residence The architects behind the World Heritage-listed Würzburg Residence drew inspiration from a spectrum of different styles, including Viennese Baroque and secular features from Italy, but it was heavily damaged during World War II. Enjoy learning about how this impressive building was restored to its former glory on a guided tour.</p></p><p>DiscoverMORE
Excursion to Rothenburg (extra expense)
Explore the best-preserved medieval town in Germany. Walk its medieval walls and climb to the top of the Town Hall Tower for a panoramic view of the town and countryside. Rothenburg offers a selection of Gothic churches, museums, art exhibitions and historic restaurants where you will enjoy a special tasting of local sausages. Please note, this operates at the same time as your included tour.

Day 11: Miltenberg (Germany)

Welcome to Miltenberg, a picturesque village on the Main River, boasting an authentic atmosphere of medieval Bavaria with its 15th-century half-timbered buildings. Set on the banks of the Main, it was a major trade hub for centuries and today has a relaxed ambience and hidden charms around every crooked corner.

Join your local guide to stroll down the cobblestone streets lined with colourful houses and view the Gothic Merchant Hall, an impressive symbol of past affluence. You'll see the oldest inn in Germany, dating back to at least 1411, Miltenberg Castle, and the unique red sandstone church and

Day 12: Rudesheim (Germany)

Today will be a highlight as you meander through the fairy tale-like surrounds of the World Heritage-listed Rhine Gorge. Admire hilltop castles and fortresses that have stood for more than 1,000 years, pass the infamous Lorelai Rock and the impressive Pfalzgrafenstein Castle. This afternoon, arrive in Rudesheim, a town with a vibrant wine-growing heritage and striking half-timbered buildings.

Catch the local mini train through the narrow city streets to Siegfried's Mechanical Music Cabinet Museum. Inside, discover a vast selection of more than 350 automatic mechanical music instruments ranging from the tiniest music box to the giant Concert-Piano-Orchestrion

Eberbach Abbey with wine tasting (extra expense)
Founded in 1136 by St. Bernard of Clairvaux, Eberbach Abbey is one of the best-preserved medieval monasteries in the Rheingau Region and boasts the largest medieval vineyard in the country. During your visit, you'll have the opportunity to indulge in a Riesling wine tasting, experiencing the vibrant flavours of the region.

Arrives On: 05 Mar 27

Day 13: Cologne (Germany)

Founded by the Romans in 50 AD, the cathedral city of Cologne is one of the oldest cities in Germany and the largest on the Rhine. The historic capital of the Rhineland is generously peppered with ancient architecture, from Roman ruins to medieval structures and the striking twin towers of the cathedral.

Included Excursion
Quest for Cologne's treasures
Join your local guide and explore the city on a walking tour, followed by a unique adventure that will take you hunting for some of Cologne's most typical treasures. You will be given a map with locations to discover the 'treasures', which are unique to the city.

Arrives On: 06 Mar 27

Day 14: Amsterdam (Netherlands)

Beyond Amsterdam's storied canals, a gentler rhythm unfolds in the Dutch countryside, where emerald-green pastures, mirror-like waterways and centuries-old windmills paint an impossibly picturesque scene. From charming towns, famed for historic cheese-making traditions, to Waterland's pretty, stilted villages and narrow canals, discover how the Dutch have shaped their landscape for generations.

Timeless Dutch countryside
Step beyond the city and discover the authentic rhythm of the Dutch countryside. Wander through charming villages, see working windmills and meet locals keeping age-old traditions alive. Watch daily life unfold as you experience the simple pleasures of life surrounded by Holland's heritage, hospitality and heart.

Hidden gems of Amsterdam (extra expense)
Explore a quieter, more authentic side of Amsterdam on this relaxed and personal tour. Travel to the historic Jordaan area to walk with your local guide to a charming chocolate shop. Continue through some of the city's most beautiful streets to Our Lord in the Attic, a unique 17th-century house that hides a secret: a fully preserved Catholic church in its attic. Enjoy a local beer and some traditional Dutch snacks at a cosy brewery before you return to the ship.

Your journey concludes in Amsterdam, a postcard-worthy destination of picturesque canals, cafés and art galleries. After breakfast, it's time to say farewell to your fellow guests and disembark your Emerald Star-Ship for your transfer to the airport, taking memories of the delightful Danube, Main and Rhine with you.
