## Itinerary

### Day 1: Hamburg (Germany)

Arrives On: 06 Sep 26

### Day 3: Honfleur (France)

Stroll through the picturesque old town of Honfleur with its half-timbered houses, historic Vieux Bassin port and the famous church of Sainte Catherine. Learn more about the town's maritime history in the Musee de la Marine or discover the works of art in the Musee Eugene Boudin. From Honfleur, you can go on excursions to see the impressive cliffs of Etretat, the Normandy landing beaches or the enchanting beach resort of Deauville.

### Day 4: Saint-Malo (France)

St Malo, a charming coastal town in Brittany, was founded in the twelfth century and was an important trading and pirate port. Today, St Malo is a popular tourist destination with an impressive city wall, historic buildings and narrow streets. The 9th century La Cité d'Aleth fortress is one of the highlights in the town. St Malo is also famous for its tides, with one of the world's highest tidal ranges of up to 14 metres (46 ft).

#### Day 6: Gijón (Spain)

From Gijon, you can explore the beautiful coastline of Asturias, with its picturesque beaches and charming fishing villages, like Cudillero and Lastres. The Picos de Europa National Park with its impressive mountain scenery is also close by. In Gijon itself, it's well worth visiting the old town, with its narrow streets and historic buildings, like San Lorenzo church and Revillagigedo Palace. The city also has a lively cultural scene, with museums, festivals and a vibrant food scene.

Beneath the castle are the romantic gardens of the Moorish Alcazaba fortress, a great place to while away some time. Wine lovers will appreciate the fertile soils of the Vega, which produce wines like Pedro Ximenez. Malaga is a feast for all the senses.

#### Day 15: Mahón, Menorca (Spain)

Welcome to Mahon, Menorca's charming capital. Discover the city's fascinating history, influenced by the Moors and the British. Stroll along the picturesque harbour and admire the impressive fortress of La Mola. Enjoy Mediterranean cuisine in the city's cosy restaurants and immerse yourself in the relaxed pace of island life. Mahon is a true gem waiting to be discovered.

#### Day 16: Palma de Mallorca (Spain)

Palma de Mallorca, the capital of the Balearic Islands, has numerous highlights on offer. An insider tip is Santa Catalina neighbourhood with its trendy cafes, bars and restaurants, where you can enjoy the local cuisine and nightlife.
