The Royal Palace and the Vasa Museum*, which houses the Vasa warship that sank in the 17th century, are further highlights. The trendy districts of Södermalm and Normalm entice visitors with their hip boutiques, cafés and restaurants. The archipelago islands off the coast offer an idyllic natural backdrop for boat trips. Stockholm impresses with its mix of history, culture and modern lifestyle.

The former Hanseatic city on the Polish Baltic coast is characterised by its long history, which is reflected in its artfully restored medieval core. Visit the famous Marienburg Castle, one of the mightiest knight's castles in Europe, on a walking tour* or combine your exploration on foot with a boat trip on the city's waterways*. An alternative excursion takes you to the popular Baltic Sea resort of Sopot*, a hotspot for bathing fans from all over the country in summer.
