Experience the wilderness actively on a hike* or by seaplane*. Cruising on the Saguenay Fjord, you may be lucky to spot belugas, which can be found hunting for fish and plankton here all year round.

Day 8: Percé, Québec (Canada)

The idyllic harbour town of Perce invites you to linger with its colorful houses, cozy cafés and local craft stores. The 438 m long and approx. 88 m high limestone rock Rocher Perce, which juts out of the sea in front of the town, is particularly impressive. Enjoy the view of the picturesque bay and rocky coastline on a boat trip*. With luck, you will spot the many bird species that live here, such as the gannet. The natural surroundings invite you to go on hikes* to discover the untouched beauty of this region.

Day 10: Prince Edward and Marion Islands (South Africa)

In Charlottetown on Prince Edward Island, you will explore the birthplace of Canada. The history of the Confederation is overruled by nature in all its glory on a scenic tour* or a visit to an oyster farm*. On the Iles de la Madeleine, red cliffs and long sandy beaches provide breathtaking island impressions*. Alternatively, a culinary tour* combines cheese, fish and the art of brewing.

Day 12: Baddeck, Nova Scotia (Canada)

From Baddeck, head to the historic Fortress of Louisbourg*, one of the largest fortified towns outside Europe. A visit to the Mi'kmaq people* will introduce you to the culture of the Native Americans.

Day 14: Halifax, Nova Scotia (Canada)

Halifax is the starting point for your scenic tour to Lunenburg*, whose districts and street names bear witness to German immigrants. Peggy's Cove and the Titanic* tell of life on the picturesque coast and the fate of a legendary ocean giant.

Day 16: Bar Harbor, Maine (United States)

The small harbour town of Bar Harbor is the gateway to the wilderness, through which you will reach dense forests when hiking in Acadia National Park* whilst enjoying the glorious hues of Indian summer.
