You will have plenty of time, since the ship will stay in Lulea for two nights. Would you like even more Nordic highlights? With a little luck, in clear weather you will be able to see the Northern Lights, observing this show of nature from the deck of your expedition ship.

Day 9: Kemi (Finland)

Kemi lies on the Gulf of Bothnia, some 30 km (19 miles) from the Swedish border. The port plays a major role in Finnish trade, especially the export of raw materials and products from the paper and forestry industries. In winter, temperatures plunge below freezing and the town is covered in a thick layer of snow. Situated close to the Arctic Circle, you can really feel the chill here: Kemi is one of the only places on earth where the sea freezes over completely in winter. To keep shipping routes open during the coldest months, several icebreakers are in use. Enjoy an intensive experience of the natural beauty of the winter landscapes around Kemi: explore the snowy forests and frozen lakes and rivers on a variety of winter adventures*. If the nights are clear, there's a good chance of seeing the Northern Lights around Kemi.

Day 10: Oulu (Finland)

Oulu in Finland is the largest urban centre in the north and the most northerly city in the European Union. Its name, which was originally spelled Owla or Oula, is derived from the Sami language and means "high water" or "flowing water". While Oulu used to be famous for wood tar and salmon, the city is now known mainly as a centre of the Finnish IT sector and for its wellness culture. Named 2026 European Capital of Culture, you can expect a colourful city life with plenty of museums, many of which are open air. Outdoor enthusiasts will be in their element in the surrounding wintry countryside. Which activities will you try?

With its wooden houses and Finnish crafts, Rauma is a deeply traditional town in Finland. The old town – a complex of 600 wooden houses, some of which have richly decorated facades – was designated a UNESCO World Heritage Site in 1991. On an independent stroll through the town, you will find little cafes and shops where you can while away some time. The art of bobbin lace has a long tradition here and you can also find out more about it in the Rauma museum: in the 18th century, up to skilful 300 lace makers made the most intricate lace bonnets by hand, and later also bed linen and tablecloths. Your experts will take up the thread and provide you with deeper insights into a variety of Scandinavian topics.

A visit to Copenhagen is on every culture lover's wish list. Outside of peak season without all the crowds, your eyes will light up in this major Scandinavian city. With the Little Mermaid, the city's tiny landmark at 125 cm (50 inches) tall, and Amalienborg Palace, your individual discoveries will be like something out of a fairy tale. The illuminated Tivoli Gardens and the picturesque harbour district of Nyhavn will ensure that typical feeling of hygge. They say that the Danes are the happiest people in the world – in any case, this fun-loving city with its intoxicating atmosphere is sure to draw you under its spell.
