Itinerary

Day 1: Reykjavík (Iceland)

Welcome to Reykjavík, the world's northernmost capital city. Your journey begins here in Iceland's quirky and creative heart. This afternoon, you'll meet the Captain and crew of your ultra-luxury Discovery Yacht, Scenic Eclipse. Be welcomed on board with a glass of Champagne and explore your spacious suite. Meet your fellow guests for a drink in the Sky Bar as you toast to the start of an epic journey. Please book your flight to arrive into Reykjavik prior to 02:00 PM. Docked: 18:00

Day 2: Grundarfjörður (Iceland)

Grundarfjörður is a picturesque town nestled in the heart of Iceland's stunning Snæfellsnes Peninsula. Surrounded by towering mountains and pristine fjords, Grundarfjörður offers a captivating blend of natural beauty and Icelandic charm. Explore the

quaint streets lined with colourful houses, or venture into the nearby wilderness to discover hidden waterfalls and volcanic landscapes. Have your camera ready to catch a glimpse of the iconic Kirkjufell mountain, a favourite among photographers and nature enthusiasts.

Scenic Freechoice:
Snæfellsnes Peninsula Express: Journey to Svodufoss, a beautiful waterfall surrounded by lush moss and dramatic rock formations. Visit Malarrið's historic lighthouse for photos, pass Londrangar's volcanic towers and stroll Arnarstapi's cliffs with seabird colonies and Bardur Snæfellsas' statue, ending with a scenic drive back to Grundarfjörður.

Coves, Craters & Caves: Admire the Snæfellsjökull Glacier's mystical 1,446m presence on the Snæfellsnes Peninsula. Ascend Saxhóll's crater for mossy lava views, walk Djupalonssandur's 1km coastal trail to Dritvík and descend Vatnshellir Cave's 35m lava tunnels, inspired by Jules Verne's classic tale: Journey to the Centre of the Earth.

Kirkjufellsfoss Waterfall Hike (led by Discovery Team): Join your Expert Discovery Team for a scenic 6km hike from Grundarfjörður Port to Kirkjufells waterfall. Located at the foot of Kirkjufell Mountain, which rises 464m (1,519 feet) above sea level, it offers one of Iceland's most picturesque waterfall scenes.

Weather permitting, today we'll visit the jewel of the Westfjords, Dynjandi Waterfall. Feel the freezing mist on your face as you admire the cascading bridal veil falls and discover why it was nicknamed 'the thunder'. Tumbling down seven tiers over 100 metres, it is one of the most beautiful waterfalls in Iceland. Marvel at nature's grandeur and wildlife spectacle as you sail through this remote corner of Iceland.

Elevate your Icelandic experience and take flight on one of two onboard helicopters, marveling at the jaw-dropping views of glaciers, volcanoes and cascading waterfalls from above. This exclusive adventure offers a breathtaking new perspective on one of the world's most dramatic landscapes.

Join the Discovery Team as they lead a scenic walk to the majestic Dynjandivogur Waterfall, known as the "jewel of the Westfjords." Experience the powerful, cascading waters as they tumble down multiple tiers, surrounded by breathtaking scenery.

Day 5: Fridtjof Nansen Halvo (Greenland)

Unlike the rest of Greenland, the Sermersooq municipality (where the Fridtjof Nansen peninsula is located) is smooth and unbroken terrain. Here, the magnificent Greenland Ice Sheet flows right to the shore. The peninsula gets its name from famed explorer Fridtjof Nansen, who launched his pioneering Greenland venture from Umivik Bay. This 1888 expedition confirmed

that Greenland was completely covered in ice.

Over the next seven days in Greenland, countless adventures await, from exhilarating whale watching to thrilling kayak excursions and invigorating polar plunges, promising unforgettable experiences.

Scenic Discovery: Weather permitting and with harbour master approval, you may get the opportunity to enjoy immersive Discovery experiences including kayaking and Zodiac cruising.

Day 6: Port information not found

Glaciers calving, rivers flowing, towering rock walls and colourful forests - the Skjoldungen Fjord is spectacular. Look up to admire huge crevasses and freestanding pillars of ice standing silhouetted against the blue Greenland sky. On the lower slopes, Arctic wildflowers will bloom amongst the dwarf birch and willow trees. Join the Discovery Team on the Observation Deck as nimble Scenic Eclipse weaves through numerous icebergs in this narrow channel and learn about the archaeological remains that have been found in this region, suggesting people lived here over 4,000 years ago.

Day 7: Prince Christian Sound (Greenland)

Carving a breathtaking, naturally formed path that separates the mainland from the islands of Cape Farewell, Prince Christian Sound is one of Greenland's most scenic waterways and a highlight of any cruise in the region. Over a hundred kilometres in length, and flanked by magnificent glaciers and granite cliffs, this narrow passage is only accessible during summer, when the largest ice blockades melt away.

With her elegant design and state-of-the-art technology, Scenic Eclipse brings you closer to the towering glaciers, icebergs and imposing peaks for unmissable photo opportunities.

Scenic Discovery: Weather permitting and with harbour master approval, experience a Zodiac landing at Herjolfsnes with the on-board Discovery Team. Once ashore, set out on a moderate hike across the tundra to explore 10th-century Norse ruins and a cemetery from a 500-year-old settlement. Keep a look out for Arctic fox and numerous birdlife.

Day 8: Narsaq (Greenland)

Set on the southern tip of Greenland, Narsaq is a striking agricultural town located on the edge of a fjord. It's known for its lush farmland, hardy sheep, legacy of Greenlandic cowboys and intriguing Norse history. In the 1960s, a long house was unearthed here, and it is believed to be the very first place Erik the Red settled in Greenland in the 10th century. Visit the Narsaq Museum, set in historic buildings around the old harbour, to learn more about the area's rich heritage.

Scenic Freechoice:
Town Walk of Narsaq: Discover the charm of Narsaq, the "Pearl of South Greenland," where colourful homes, sweeping wilderness views and rich Inuit heritage come together. Conclude your walk with free time at the local museum, exploring stories of the region's past and present.

Food & Beer Tasting at Hotel Narsaq: Savour Greenlandic delicacies and local craft beers at Hotel Narsaq while learning about Inuit culinary traditions and their deep ties to the land and sea.

Brewery Visit & Beer Tasting: Stroll from Narsaq's harbour to a local brewery for a guided tour with the brewmaster, then sample distinctive Arctic-inspired beers brewed with care in Greenland.

Iceberg Safari: From Narsaq, cruise among drifting icebergs to see their shifting hues, hear their crackle and touch ancient ice, an unforgettable glimpse of Greenland's icy wonders.

Arctic Beach Walk to Dyrenæs: Enjoy a scenic guided walk along the Arctic coastline to Dyrenæs, exploring unexcavated Norse and Inuit ruins, including 1000 AD Viking Dyrnæs and Landnamsgård sites. Learn of early settlers in this untouched Arctic landscape.

Day 9: Nuuk (Godthaab) (Greenland)

Clinging to a jagged peninsula on the southwest coast of Greenland, Nuuk is the island's capital and largest city. The area has been inhabited since 2200BC, though the present town was only established in 1728. Colourful wooden buildings can be seen around the shore, while more modern apartment buildings house most of the city's 20,000 inhabitants. A guided tour through the picturesque Old Harbour reveals history and traditions that remain strong. Nuuk is also becoming known as a centre of modern Nordic culture, with edgy architecture inspired by the Northern Lights and innovative restaurants using local ingredients.

Scenic Freechoice:
Nuuk Guided Walk: Enjoy a leisurely guided walk through the local area before visiting a welcoming family home. Share coffee, cake and conversation for a warm glimpse into everyday life and local traditions.

Hike Quasussuaq: Embark on a guided hike up Quasussuaq, one of the region's most iconic peaks, and take in panoramic views of the fjords crowned by the majestic Sermitsiaq.

Nuuk City Walk with Museum & Tasting: Discover Nuuk's charm on a guided walk through its historic heart, then explore the National Museum's famous mummies and captivating Inuit and Norse stories, ending with a

relaxing tasting of Greenlandic delicacies at the Katuaq Cultural Centre.

Fjord Safari Boat: Cruise into the Ice fjord north of Nuuk to marvel at towering blue icebergs, as your captain finds the perfect spot for breathtaking views.

Day 10: Evighedsfjorden (Greenland)

Enjoy a slow day cruising through Evighed Fjord, or 'Eternity Fjord', considered one of the most beautiful in Greenland. Stretching for more than 75 kilometres, you'll be awed by the endless fields of ice glittering under the sun. Tall, jagged peaks threaded with glaciers rise straight up out of the calm blue waters. Many of the glaciers are very active and you will likely hear chunks of ice calving away and collapsing loudly into the ocean. In Evighed Fjord, you'll feel the beauty and power of nature all around you.

Scenic Discovery: Weather permitting and with harbour master approval, you may get the opportunity to enjoy immersive Discovery experiences including kayaking and Zodiac cruising.

Day 11: Ilulissat (Jakobshavn) (Greenland)

Here, you'll visit the "By Heart" store for Musk-ox wool talks and traditional kaffemik events and join a city tour to learn about the American history of this small, inland town.

Day 17: Sisimiut (Holsteinsborg) (Greenland)

Sitting around 40 kilometres north of the Arctic Circle, Sisimiut is the second-largest town in Greenland. With colourful houses sprinkled around a picturesque bay, the town is bathed in perpetual sunlight during the summer months. Explore Sisimiut's rich history, dating back some 4,500 years, at the local museum, which has a collection of ancient Saqqaq artifacts. You'll have the opportunity to purchase souvenirs crafted from qiviut, the inner wool of a muskox, such as scarves, hats, or mittens. Immerse yourself in authentic interactions with local communities, adding depth and authenticity to your Arctic experience.

Scenic Freechoice: Sisimiut Town Walk: Stroll through Sisimiut at a relaxed pace, exploring the old town, Nalunnguarfik Lake and the colourful houses on Saaliimiip Aqq, while discovering the town's history, culture and everyday life.

Mountain Discover Hike: Venture into Greenland's wild beauty with a hike along the Arctic Circle Trail. Cross clear-water creeks, discover delicate Arctic flora and take in breathtaking mountain views before returning to the ship energized and inspired.

Sitting at the northern tip of the island of Newfoundland, L'Anse aux Meadows is the site of the first recorded European contact with North America. It's a true milestone in the history of human migration and discovery. Now a World Heritage Site, it marks the sole Viking-established settlement on the continent, dating back to the 11th century. The archaeological remnants, including remnants of wood-framed peat-turf buildings, mirror those found in Norse Greenland Iceland. Exploring the site, you'll embark on a fascinating journey tracing the footsteps of Vikings who arrived in North America centuries before Columbus.

Scenic Freechoice: The Great Viking Experience: Explore Canada's top Viking sites at L'Anse aux Meadows, a UNESCO World Heritage Site, and nearby Norstead Viking Village. Discover Viking life through interactive exhibits, reconstructed sod huts, and a historic trading port that brings their legendary journeys to life.

On the water, the cove is divided into Inner and Outer Bonne Bay. Inner Bonne Bay boasts serene wooded coves and sandy beaches, while Outer Bonne Bay serves as the gateway to the majestic Bonne Bay fjord.

Woody Point Cultural & Culinary Experience: Stroll through Woody Point's charming village with a local guide, explore heritage buildings and indulge in a private tasting of authentic Newfoundland specialties on this cultural and culinary journey.

Kayaking Hidden Coves of Bonne Bay: Glide through Bonne Bay's tranquil waters in premium sea kayaks with expert guides. Explore hidden coves and coastal trails inaccessible by larger boats, paddle beneath dramatic cliffs, spot seabirds and otters, and enjoy a warm beverage on a secluded shore.

Scenic cruise in Bonne Bay: Explore the breathtaking fjords of Bonne Bay on a scenic cruise through one of Newfoundland's most remarkable landscapes. Admire views of Gros Morne Mountain and the Tablelands while watching for whales, seabirds, and other wildlife along the way.

It's the largest historical reconstruction in North America and authentic fortifications, kitchen gardens and homes sit alongside the original ruins. Uncover the secrets of this World Heritage-listed site as you wander through its picturesque streets and soak in the unique atmosphere.

Fortress of Louisbourg: Step back to 1744 at the Fortress of Louisbourg, Canada's largest historical reconstruction. Explore bustling streets, meet costumed locals, and enjoy a taste of heritage chocolate in this immersive 18th-century seaport experience.

Heart of the Island: Experience Cape Breton's Scottish soul at the Nova Scotia Highland Village. Explore historic homes, hear Gaelic stories, and take in breathtaking views of the Bras d'Or Lakes on this immersive cultural journey through 180 years of heritage.

Coal Miners of Cape Breton: Discover the rich coal-mining heritage of Cape Breton at the Glace Bay Miners Museum.

Day 24: Halifax, Nova Scotia (Canada)

Halifax, Nova Scotia's dynamic capital, has long been tied to the sea. It has one of the largest and deepest ice-free harbours in the world, and has been an important military and commercial port for more than 250 years. Today, you can learn about its rich cultural heritage through the city's many museums and historical sites. Wander through bustling downtown streets and picturesque waterfronts, savouring maritime delights and charming cafes. A late departure gives you time to sample the city's famed live music scene, which takes over historic pubs and cosy venues every night of the week.

Peggy's Cove & Lobster Lunch: Experience the best of Nova Scotia with a scenic drive to Peggy's Cove, famed for its lighthouse and coastal charm. Explore the village, then savour a traditional Atlantic lobster lunch.

Historic Halifax & Citadel: Uncover Halifax's rich history on a guided tour to landmarks including the Citadel Fortress, Province House and the stunning Victorian Public Gardens. Stroll historic streets, enjoy harbour views and explore restored seaport buildings.

Tall Ship Harbour Sail & Seafood Feast: Set sail on a scenic tall ship cruise through Halifax Harbour. Enjoy a glass of wine or local craft beer as the crew shares seafaring tales and a local fiddler brings Nova Scotia's maritime spirit to life.

Peggys Cove: Follow Nova Scotia's scenic Lighthouse Route to the iconic village of Peggy's Cove. Explore its famous lighthouse, colourful coastal homes, and dramatic granite shoreline, with time to wander, take photos, and enjoy the ocean views.

Day 25: Lunenburg, Nova Scotia (Canada)

Lunenburg is one of Canada's most beautiful towns, a World Heritage-listed site where 70 per cent of the original buildings from the 18th and 19th centuries still stand. It is the best surviving example of a British colonial settlement in North America, set out along an orderly grid pattern. You'll be charmed by its picturesque colourful houses and architectural wonders like the Lunenburg Academy, the pink Wedding Cake House, and St. John's Anglican Church. The historic waterfront is now home to a lively mix of restaurants, breweries, distilleries and boutiques, all of which embrace the town's proud seafaring legacy.
