Itinerary

Day 1: Queenstown (New Zealand)

Kia Ora and welcome to New Zealand. You'll begin your journey in Queenstown, with some time at leisure and an overnight stay before you board your ultra-luxury Discovery Yacht. Queenstown is renowned as New Zealand's outdoor and adventure capital, offering everything from hiking and biking to water sports, horse riding, rafting and even bungee jumping.You might like to spend a few nights here before the start of your journey to experience the Kiwi's taste for adventure.

Arrives On: 18 Nov 24

Day 2: Queenstown (New Zealand)

This morning you will be transferred via coach from Queenstown to Bluff, where your ultra-luxury Discovery Yacht awaits. Marvel at the awe-inspiring scenery of rugged mountains, serene lakes, and lush forests.Step on board Scenic Eclipse II and be warmly greeted with a glass of Champagne. Day 3: Milford Sound (New Zealand)

Day 4: Oban, Stewart Island (New Zealand)

Stewart Island sits 30 kilometres off the southern tip of the South Island. It is one of the last inhabited outposts before you reach Antarctica, with its only settlement, the tiny village of Oban, clinging bravely to the northern shore.

Arrives On: 21 Nov 24

Day 5: Port Chalmers (New Zealand)

Wake up in Port Chalmers, the port for the city of Dunedin. The oldest European settlement in New Zealand, it was founded in 1848 and has a proud Scottish lineage – in fact, Dunedin is the old Gaelic name for Edinburgh. Stroll the well-preserved streets to admire the grand Victorian and Edwardian architecture built with funds from the area's gold rush.span>Outside town, the surrounding Otago Peninsula is regarded as one of the country's top wildlife and eco-tourism destinations. Look out for the abundant birds, penguins, seals and sea lions.

Arrives On: 22 Nov 24

Day 6: Akaroa (New Zealand)

Arrive this morning at Akaroa, the only French settlement in New Zealand. Founded by French whalers in the 1840s, it retains its French street names, charming Gallic cottages, excellent cuisine and plethora of cheese shops.strong>Freechoice:
Canterbury Sheep Farm Experience: Get an insight into New Zealand's famous sheep industry. See shearing, sheep dogs and typical farm life.

Chr />Punting on the Avon & Wine: Take a leisurely cruise in a flat-bottomed boat along Christchurch's scenic Avon River. Then visit Melton Estate Winery for a tasting.

Akaroa Harbour Wildlife Cruise: Discover the adorable and playful Hector's dolphins, found only in NZ waters. (Wildlife sightings not guaranteed)

Akaroa Walking Tour: Enjoy a delightful 45-minute walking tour of Akaroa, strolling through the centre of the town, up a local lookout and along the picturesque waterfront.

Arrives On: 23 Nov 24

Day 7: Kaikoura (New Zealand)

Sailing north along the east coast of the island, you'll arrive in Kaikoura early this morning. This tiny town sits in a spectacular natural environment, flanked by the Pacific Ocean on one side and the snow-capped Seaward Kaikoura Range on the other. The town began life as a whaling station in the mid 1800s; visit the oldest surviving building, Fyffe House, or the Kaikoura Museum to learn more about its history.span>It's an ideal place for wildlife encounters. Whales, fur seals and dolphins live permanently in these waters, and an impressive array of seabirds fill the air, including the mighty albatross.span>strong>Freechoice:
br />Kaikoura Whale Watch Cruise: Venture into the Pacific's depths for aweinspiring encounters with magnificent sperm whales while expert guides share their insights.
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br />Albatross Encounter Cruise: Discover Kaikoura's renowned birdlife on a 2.5-hour tour. Guides will throw chum into the water to attract albatross and more.
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br />Kaikoura Sightseeing Overview: Explore Kaikoura's stunning seaside landscape features a three-hour tour with a bush walk, Ohau stream, Ohau Point, and a fur seal colony, offering beautiful coastal vistas and a photo stop.

Kaikoura Coastal Panorama Walk: The half-day walking tour visits a main lookout with stunning mountain and ocean views, Fyffe House, and a seal colony.

Arrives On: 24 Nov 24

Day 8: Kaiteriteri, South Island (New Zealand)

Scenic Eclipse II will call at two ports in Tasman Bay today. Kaiteriteri is arguably New Zealand's most beautiful beach, a perfect arc of golden sand fronting startlingly blue water. It's also the gateway to the Abel Tasman National Park, a gorgeous coastal park known for its sea kayaking, walks and wildlife.

One of the sunniest cities in New Zealand, it's bursting with open-air cafes, bustling markets, breweries, cycling trails and the pretty Botanic Gardens. Enjoy a late departure tonight, giving you a chance to experience a little Kiwi hospitality after dark.

Day 9: Picton (New Zealand)

Wake up early this morning so you can experience the beauty of sailing into the Marlborough Sounds. Ask the butler to bring you coffee to your suite so you can soak it in from your private verandah.span>Spend the morning in Picton, a picturesque small town that looks almost tropical with its towering palm trees and clear turquoise water. Wander the pretty waterfront promenade, lined with shops, cafes and galleries, or visit the museum inside the Edwin Fox convict ship dry docked offshore. Picton is a short drive from the famous Marlborough wine region, which produces around two thirds of New Zealand's

Queen Charlotte Sounds Explorer: Cruise through the beautiful Queen Charlotte Sound, enjoying commentary from your friendly guide, and explore Arapawa Island formerly a whaling base and now flourishing with aquaculture.

Marlborough Sounds Link Pathway Walk: Follow the new Link Pathway on a guided walk. Admire views of Marlborough Sounds and Queen Charlotte Sound and look for native birds.

Wine of Marlborough: Discover New Zealand's wine country on a scenic tour from Picton. Enjoy stunning views and wine tasting in Marlborough wine region.

Seafood Odyssea: Cruise Queen Charlotte Sound, enjoying local delicacies and scenic views. Learn about the region's history and wildlife from expert crew.

Arrives On: 26 Nov 24

Day 10: Napier (New Zealand)

Wake up in Napier this morning and you'll feel as if you've stepped back almost 100 years into the past. In 1931, the centre of the town was razed by an earthquake and then rebuilt in the Art Deco style of the day. Today, it retains all the charm and style of its heyday with the largest collection of authentic Art Deco buildings on earth.
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br />Cape Kidnappers & Gannet Safari: Drive along the Hawke's Bay coast to the gannet colony. See them dive into the sea and observe their distinctive behaviors while also keeping an eye out for newly hatched chicks.
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br />Hawkes Bay Express: Explore Napier on a modern road train, travelling along Main Street, admiring early settler's homes, visiting the old port village and hearing stories of the past.
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br />A Tale of Two Hawkes Bay Wineries: Enjoy a panoramic drive through Hawke's Bay coast, stopping at two award-winning wineries.
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Art Deco City Walking Tour: Discover Napier's Art Deco highlights, starting with a short film about the 1931 earthquake followed by a guided walking tour of the city centre.

Pinot and Pecorino: Departing from Napier, you'll journey to Craggy Range Sheep Dairy for a behind-the-scenes look at sheep milking, followed by a tasting of award-winning cheese paired with local wine.
Enjoy breathtaking views and a scenic drive back.

Day 11: Wellington (New Zealand)

Wellington, perched on the Cook Strait, is dubbed the windiest city. Stroll its walkable centre, visit the iconic Beehive Parliament Building, and explore designer boutiques, galleries, and museums. Known as "Wellywood," it's also New Zealand's film hub, home to Weta Workshop, famed for "The Hobbit" and "Lord of the Rings" films.

Wellington by Foot: This guided walk includes the historical district, Parliament Grounds and the National Library and Wellington's iconic waterfront featuring stunning harbour views.Enrich
Maori Cultural Performance: Take a quick trip from the Port of Wellington to the Whare Tapere Building, where you'll receive a traditional Maori welcome. Enjoy a Powhiri and Kapa Haka performances and learn about local history and legends.

Arrives On: 28 Nov 24

Day 12: New Plymouth (New Zealand)

You'll sail north overnight to arrive at the port of New Plymouth this morning. Sitting in the shadow of the conical shape of Mount Taranaki, it's a sunny city where the locals like to spend as much time as they can outside.span>New Plymouth is also home to some of New Zealand's top cultural institutions. Puke Ariki is a combined museum, library and heritage centre with many fascinating local artifacts. The Govett-Brewster Art Gallery/Len Lye Centre, inside a spectacular reflective steel building, is the country's first and only museum of contemporary art. Car aficionados will love the Hillsborough Holden Museum.span>strong>Freechoice:
br />West Coast Boat Tour: Sail on an authentic 1953 English Life boat to the Sugar Loaf Islands, where you can see diverse bird species, spot playful fur seals, and be immersed in local lore.
br />Len Lye Centre with New Plymouth City Tour: Explore the highlights including Port Taranaki, Te Rewa Rewa bridge, Bowls of Brooklands, Wind Wand and the Len Lye Centre.
br />Str />Wine Tasting & Pukeiti Gardens: Visit Pukeiti Garden, a 360-hectare rainforest in the foothills of Mount Taranaki, then enjoy a tasting at Okurukuru Winery with coastal views.

Day 15: Norfolk Island (Norfolk Island)

A tiny dot in the middle of the South Pacific, Norfolk Island is more than 800 kilometres north-west of the New Zealand coast and almost 1,500 kilometres east of Australia. The first thing you'll see will be the tall Norfolk pines dotted along the clifftops, looking out over windswept coastline, deserted beaches and surging seas.span>Though the island is technically part of Australia, it has its own distinct personality and a fascinating past. It's been an agricultural settlement, harsh convict prison and the final home of the Pitcairn Islanders, descendants of the Bounty mutineers and their Tahitian wives.span>strong>Freechoice:
br />Half-Day Extravaganza: Visit Norfolk Island's historic areas, such as Kingston, Cascade, and Longridge. Admire the spectacular scenery and learn about its unique history.
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Historic Kingston Experience: Embark on a half-day tour of the island's history, including the World Heritage-listed Kingston settlement.

br />Sehind the Scenes: Experience Norfolk Island life by visiting local businesses. Meet owners, sample their products, and pick up some local goods to take home.

Bush Walk Adventure: Choose a gentle stroll through Palm Glen Reserve or a leisurely 3.5km walk up scenic Mt Bates, the island's highest point. Reach the Captain Cook Monument for panoramic coastal views.

Day 17: Bay of Islands (New Zealand)

The Bay of Islands is one of the world's most spectacular sailing destinations, so make sure you're on your verandah or the Observation Terrace as you arrive mid-morning. With its unique sub-tropical climate, around 150 islands and thousands of postcard-perfect coves, this is a little slice of paradise on the North Island.span>Scenic Eclipse II will anchor off the coast of Paihia, famous for its watersports of kayaking, fishing, parasailing, scuba diving, and more. Nearby is the Waitangi Treaty Grounds, where the foundation document of New Zealand was signed in 1840.strong>Freechoice:
br />Northland Maori Waka Encounter: A thrilling Maori War Canoe tour. Explore historic sites, paddle over Waitangi River estuaries and visit Haruru Falls, while a guide shares legends and customs.

Day 18: Auckland (New Zealand)

You'll finish your journey in the nation's largest city, Auckland. Home to around a third of the entire New Zealand population, Auckland is a stylish, cosmopolitan city set around two grand harbours. It's packed with fascinating museums, world-class art galleries and stylish shops featuring local designers.
