Itinerary

Day 1: Wellington (New Zealand)

Welcome to Wellington, the capital city of New Zealand, renowned for its vibrant culture, stunning natural scenery, and dynamic arts scene. Step on board Scenic Eclipse II and be warmly greeted with a glass of Champagne. Settle into your luxurious suite, meet your butler and fellow travellers and toast to the journey ahead.Please book your flight to arrive into Wellington prior to 12:00 PM.

Day 2: New Plymouth (New Zealand)

You'll sail north overnight to arrive at the port of New Plymouth this morning. Sitting in the shadow of the conical shape of Mount Taranaki, it's a sunny city where the locals like to spend as much time as they can outside.New Plymouth is also home to some of New Zealand's top cultural institutions. Puke Ariki is a combined museum, library and heritage centre with many fascinating local artifacts. The Govett-Brewster Art Gallery/Len Lye Centre, inside a spectacular reflective steel building, is the country's first and only museum of contemporary art. Car aficionados will love the Hillsborough Holden Museum.strong>Freechoice:
West Coast Boat Tour: Sail on an authentic 1953 English Life boat to the Sugar Loaf Islands, where you can see diverse bird species, spot playful fur seals, and be immersed in local lore.

Len Lye Centre with New Plymouth City Tour: Explore the highlights including Port Taranaki, Te Rewa Rewa bridge, Bowls of Brooklands, Wind Wand and the Len Lye Centre.

Wine Tasting & Pukeiti Gardens: Visit Pukeiti Garden, a 360-hectare rainforest in the foothills of Mount Taranaki, then enjoy a tasting at Okurukuru Winery with coastal views.

Day 5: Norfolk Island (Norfolk Island)

A tiny dot in the middle of the South Pacific, Norfolk Island is more than 800 kilometres north-west of the New Zealand coast and almost 1,500 kilometres east of Australia. The first thing you'll see will be the tall Norfolk pines dotted along the clifftops, looking out over windswept coastline, deserted beaches and surging seas.>span>Though the island is technically part of Australia, it has its own distinct personality and a fascinating past. It's been an agricultural settlement, harsh convict prison and the final home of the Pitcairn Islanders, descendants of the Bounty mutineers and their Tahitian wives.>span>Freechoice:
br />Half-Day Extravaganza: Visit Norfolk Island's historic areas, such as Kingston, Cascade, and Longridge. Admire the spectacular scenery and learn about its unique history.
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Historic Kingston Experience: Embark on a half-day tour of the island's history, including the World Heritage-listed Kingston settlement.
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br />Behind the Scenes: Experience Norfolk Island life by visiting local businesses. Meet owners, sample their products, and pick up some local goods to take home.
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br />Bush Walk Adventure: Choose a gentle stroll through Palm Glen Reserve or a leisurely 3.5km walk up scenic Mt Bates, the island's highest point. Reach the Captain Cook Monument for panoramic coastal views.

Day 7: Bay of Islands (New Zealand)

The Bay of Islands is one of the world's most spectacular sailing destinations, so make sure you're on your verandah or the Observation Terrace as you arrive mid-morning. With its unique sub-tropical climate, around 150 islands and thousands of postcard-perfect coves, this is a little slice of paradise on the North Island.Scenic Eclipse II will anchor off the coast of Paihia, famous for its watersports of kayaking, fishing, parasailing, scuba diving, and more. Nearby is the Waitangi Treaty Grounds, where the foundation document of New Zealand was signed in 1840. Encounter: A thrilling Maori War Canoe tour. Explore historic sites, paddle over Waitangi River estuaries and visit Haruru Falls, while a guide shares legends and customs.

Bay Of Islands Lunch Cruise: Sail through the waterways of Opua and Okiato and learn about the colourful people and events that shaped this country before a delicious lunch.

Historic Waitangi Treaty Grounds: Join a local guide for an engaging tour of the Treaty Grounds, including a Maori Cultural Performance and time to explore the museums.

Glowworms and Kauri Forest: Immerse yourself in the tranquillity of the Puketi Kauri Forest and journey through the Kawiti Caves, illuminated by shimmering glowworms.

Day 8: Auckland (New Zealand)

You'll finish your journey in the nation's largest city, Auckland. Home to around a third of the entire New Zealand population, Auckland is a stylish, cosmopolitan city set around two grand harbours. It's packed with fascinating museums, world-class art galleries and stylish shops featuring local designers.
