Itinerary

Day 1: Montréal, Québec (Canada)

Welcome to Montreal. The largest French-speaking city in the Americas, Montreal has European flair and is known for its festivals, arts and good food. Spend the day wandering historic cobblestoned streets, including atmospheric Rue Saint-Paul in Old Montreal. Gaze inside the 19th-century Gothic Revival Basilique Notre-Dame, or order a bagel or some poutine to go (the city's famous French fries, cheese curds and gravy). On board Scenic Eclipse, you'll meet the Captain, the crew and your butler. Settle into your spacious suite and join your fellow guests at the Sky Bar for a glass of Champagne before setting sail for your unforgettable journey towards New York City. Day 2: Quebec City, Québec (Canada)

Considered the cradle of French America, Quebec City is a World Heritage-listed fortified city founded in 1608. Step through more than 400 years of history in its charming cobblestone Old Town set within gates, towers and ramparts complete with cannons.

Perched atop the headland inside is the century-old Chateau Frontenac, which now houses the luxurious Fairmont Chateau Frontenac hotel and Notre-Dame de Quebec Cathedral. The 425-metre wooden boardwalk Dufferin Terrace, which is frequented by street entertainers, has views over St Lawrence River and the Lower Town. See the city lights twinkle as your ultra-luxury Discovery Yacht departs port tonight.

Scenic Freechoice:

- Historic Quebec with Montmorency Falls: Explore Quebec City's highlights, including Château Frontenac, Place-Royale, and the Plains of Abraham, with scenic views of the St. Lawrence River. End with a visit to the dramatic Montmorency Falls.
- Fortification National Historic Site Walking Tour: Stroll the cobblestone streets of North America's only walled city, a UNESCO World Heritage Site. See Place-Royale, Petit-Champlain, and take the funicular to Upper Town to explore Château Frontenac, Dufferin Terrace, and Forts-and-Château-Saint-Louis with stunning river and city views.
- Old Quebec Walk & Riedel Tasting at the Chateau: Walk Old Quebec's charming streets, visit Château Frontenac and Dufferin Terrace, then enjoy a guided Riedel wine tasting with gourmet snacks.
- Île of Orléans Food Tour: Explore the scenic villages of Île d'Orléans and sample local delights including fruit preserves, wine, and hand-crafted nougat. Learn about traditional Quebecois craftsmanship and winemaking while enjoying breathtaking views of the St. Lawrence River and surrounding countryside.

- "This Is Our Story" Indigenous Cultural Evening: Enjoy an exclusive evening at Musée de la Civilisation celebrating the culture and traditions of Canada's First Nations and Inuit communities. Savour Indigenous-inspired bites and immersive performances of music, dance and storytelling, with the option to explore the "This Is Our Story" exhibition.

Day 3: Port information not found

Experience the splendour of scenic cruising along the St. Lawrence River today. This mighty waterway snakes for more than 1200 kilometres connecting Canada's Great Lakes to the Atlantic Ocean. It is known for the 40-plus traditional lighthouses that have helped sailors navigate this river for centuries.

Relax on board with a coffee on the private verandah of your spacious suite or dining with new friends in the casual Azure Bar & Café, as you pass quaint fishing villages. You may be lucky to view the riverside hardwood forests in their fiery autumnal glory at this time of year.

Day 4: Charlottetown, Prince Edward Island (Canada)

Charlottetown is Prince Edward Island's vibrant capital – a small city with an island lifestyle. Prince Edward Island played a significant role in the confederation of Canada but its original occupants, the Mi'kmaq, lived here for 12,000 years. One of its biggest claims to fame is being the hometown of Lucy Maud Montgomery, who penned the classic novel *Anne of Green Gables*. It's also a huge fishing and seafood destination with some 1000 kilometres of coastline and white-sand beaches. Explore the city's well-preserved history and architectural treasures, its bustling harbour and picturesque waterfront boardwalk.

Scenic Freechoice: Green Gables & Island Delights: Discover Prince Edward Island charm with visits to historic Charlottetown, Green Gables House, scenic red cliffs and enjoy tea and local preserves at the Island Preserve Company.

Historic Lighthouses & Winery: Explore Prince Edward Island's coastal charm with visits to Point Prim and Wood Island's lighthouses, then sample wines and local cheeses at Rossignol Estate Winery while enjoying views of the Northumberland Strait.

Savour the Flavour: Experience the flavours of Canada's Maritimes on a guided walk featuring seafood tastings, local drinks, regional specialities, and dessert, all paired with stories of the area's heritage.

Guided Horseback & Countryside Journey: Discover Prince Edward Island on a scenic horseback ride through forest trails and along the coastline, followed by free time and a local ice cream treat before returning via a picturesque route.

Oyster Shuck and Learn: Discover Prince Edward Island's oyster heritage on a guided visit to a coastal oyster farm, featuring a shucking demonstration, hands-on experience, and a tasting of fresh oysters paired with local beverages.

Day 5: Pictou, Nova Scotia (Canada)

The Port of Pictou has a rich heritage as the Birthplace of New Scotland and as one of the province's largest lobster fisheries – it even hosts an annual lobster carnival. Spend the morning exploring the buzzy waterfront and museums where you can learn about its Scottish heritage and fishing industry.

Back on board, enjoy the panoramic views of rugged coastlines and historic lighthouses as we sail through Canso Strait. Curl up in a cabana on Deck 10 with a drink as you admire the ever-changing scenery or soak it up from the Observation Lounge.

Scenic Freechoice: Hector Heritage Quay & Scottish Legacy: Discover Pictou's rich Scottish roots at Hector Heritage Quay, home to a full-scale replica of the ship Hector. Enjoy a guided stroll along the historic waterfront as you uncover the stories and traditions that shaped this charming coastal community.

Walking Heritage and Shortbread Tour: Step into Pictou's past on a private guided walk through its historic streets, where Scottish-inspired architecture and rich heritage come to life. End with an exclusive visit to Mrs. MacGregor's Shortbreads, discovering the story and craft behind these iconic treats.

Discover the Strait Boat Tour: Set sail on a relaxed cruise along the Northumberland Strait into Pictou Harbour, where coastal scenery and local stories unfold. Led by experienced lobster

captains, this authentic experience offers rare insight into maritime traditions, with a hands-on glimpse into life on the water.

Day 6: Halifax, Nova Scotia (Canada)

Spend the day in Halifax, Nova Scotia's dynamic capital. This historic port city has a Downtown district boasting a four-kilometre harbourside boardwalk filled with restaurants, shops, museums, beer gardens and public art. Argyle Street is another happening area with live theatres and pubs that spill out on to the streets.

For a change of pace, Halifax Public Gardens occupy an entire block, complete with manicured lawns and floral displays. The hilltop fortress Halifax Citadel National Historic Site overlooks the city; a cannon has been fired here every day at noon since 1857 (except on Christmas Day).

Peggy's Cove & Lobster Lunch: Enjoy Nova Scotia's coastal beauty with a visit to Peggy's Cove, time to explore the iconic lighthouse village, and a traditional Maritime treat: a fresh Atlantic lobster lunch.
Historic Halifax & Citadel: Experience Halifax's heritage with a visit to the Citadel Fortress, scenic city views and the charming Public Gardens, along with historic landmarks like Province House and the waterfront Historic Properties.
Ship Harbour Sail & Seafood Feast: Sail Halifax's historic harbour, enjoy stunning waterfront views, a fresh seafood feast with local wine or beer, and lively fiddle music celebrating Nova Scotia's maritime spirit.
Peggys Cove: Discover Nova Scotia's scenic Lighthouse Route on a journey to Peggy's Cove, where rugged coastal landscapes, the iconic lighthouse, and colourful fishing village charm await, along with free time to explore at your own pace.

Day 7: Lunenburg, Nova Scotia (Canada)

A former rum-running and ship-building town, Lunenburg is arguably Canada's most beautiful town. This World Heritage-listed site is a picturesque village with architectural wonders such as the 19th-century Victorian-style Lunenburg Academy, the pink Wedding Cake House, and the 18th-century St. John's Anglican Church. The town is known for being one of the British Empire's first Protestant settlements in Nova Scotia. It's an extremely walkable city, so enjoy a relaxing day exploring its brightly painted homes, sample locally caught seafood, and find its many galleries and artisan studios.

Scenic Freechoice:

/>Historic Lunenburg & Mahone Bay: Discover Lunenburg's colourful harbour and historic streets, visit Mahone Bay's iconic waterfront churches, and explore Nova Scotia's maritime heritage at the Fisheries Museum of the Atlantic.

Gaff Point Hiking Trail: Hike the scenic Gaff Point Trail, enjoying coastal forests, beaches and rugged Atlantic views. Spot wildlife along the way and relax with a light picnic on a secluded beach.

Lunenburg Walking Tour: Stroll Lunenburg's historic streets with a local guide, exploring its colourful waterfront, maritime heritage and the Fisheries Museum of the Atlantic. Enjoy time to browse shops, take photos, or savour fresh seafood.</p><p>Anchored: 8:00 - 14:00</p>

Day 8: Bar Harbor, Maine (United States)

<p>Discover the coastal beauty of Bar Harbor. This is the gateway to Acadia National Park, which protects the highest rocky headlands along the Atlantic Coast, as well as a landscape of ocean cliffs and rocky beaches, glacier-formed lakes and boreal forest. The town was a favourite summer getaway for the rich and famous in the 19th century, but many of its luxury homes on 'Millionaires Row' were destroyed by fire in 1947. Despite this, the town is filled with charm, with colourful clapboard storefronts and a variety of restaurants that serve lobster and wild blueberry-inspired dishes (Maine's official fruit).</p><p>Scenic Freechoice:
Acadia National Park & Cadillac Mountain: Enjoy a scenic drive through Acadia National Park, stopping at stunning overlooks along the rugged Maine coast. Ascend Cadillac Mountain for panoramic views of cliffs, forests and the Atlantic Ocean.

Lobster Hauling & Coastal Cruise: Join a local fisherman aboard a lobster boat in Frenchman Bay to see lobster traps hauled and learn about Maine's maritime life. Cruise past scenic shores, spot wildlife and enjoy a fresh lobster tasting ashore.

Bar Harbor Village & Culinary Walk: Stroll Bar Harbor's charming streets with a local guide, sampling regional specialties and learning about the town's historic Gilded Age past, and coastal culture.

Acadia Kayaking Adventure: Paddle Frenchman Bay's scenic waters, passing granite cliffs and pine-covered islets. Learn about Acadia's ecosystems from your guide and pause on a secluded shoreline to enjoy a local snack.

Acadia National Park Walk: Discover the natural beauty of Acadia National Park on a guided journey through forest trails, glacial landscapes and historic carriage roads, with scenic views of Jordan Pond, Cadillac Mountain and Bar Harbor. </p><p>Anchored: 8:00 - 18:00</p>

Day 9: Provincetown, Massachusetts (United States)

<p>Follow the creative footsteps of Jackson Pollock in his spiritual hometown of Provincetown, Massachusetts. Since the 1940s, this coastal haven has lured artists to its shores – it is, after all, a place that celebrates freedom of expression and individuality. Indulge in a trolley

tour for an exclusive experience of 'P-town,' explore galleries, and savour culinary delights at renowned restaurants. </p><p>Tonight, we will pass through the Cape Cod Canal transit, Massachusetts's iconic water passage.</p><p>Scenic Freechoice:
Provincetown Walking Tour: Explore the coastal charm of Provincetown on a guided walk-through historic streets, hidden gardens and picturesque seaside neighbourhoods rich in maritime heritage.

National Seashore Tour: Discover the natural beauty and coastal heritage of Provincetown on a scenic journey through the Cape Cod National Seashore. Enjoy sweeping dune and ocean views, visit historic Pilgrim Landing, and take a peaceful guided walk through the tranquil landscapes of Beech Forest.

Pilgrim Monument & Provincetown History: Step back to 1620 at the Pilgrim Monument and Provincetown Museum, where your guide shares the town's pivotal role in early American history. End with scenic harbour views while exploring local heritage, maritime history and cultural traditions.

Provincetown Whale Watching Adventure: Set sail in Stellwagen Bank National Marine Sanctuary with a marine biologist, spotting humpback whales and other wildlife while cruising Provincetown's sparkling waters.</p><p>Anchored: 11:00 - 19:00</p>

Day 10: Martha's Vineyard, Massachusetts (United States)

<p>With a population of just over 4000, the small town of Oak Bluffs is a beacon of inclusivity and diversity. It's located on the island of Martha's Vineyard – which ironically has no operating vineyards – the setting of Dorothy West's Harlem Renaissance novel The Wedding. The town comprises charming 19th-century pastel-coloured gingerbread cottages, an ocean park, the oldest continually operating carousel in the United States, and enchanting views of Nantucket Sound.</p><p>Tonight perhaps meet your new friends at Sushi @ Koko's for dinner. Enjoy entertainment in the state-of-the-art theatre and unwind with a nightcap at the Scenic Lounge Bar.</p><p>Scenic Freechoice:
Martha's Vineyard Coastal Bike Ride: Explore Oak Bluffs' scenic coast on a guided e-bike tour, stopping at Ocean Park and East Chop Lighthouse for panoramic island views. Pause for a drink overlooking the Vineyard Sound while enjoying light exercise and local insights.

Oak Bluffs Historic Highlights & Flying Horses: Experience the history and charm of Oak Bluffs on a guided tour, visiting the Flying Horses Carousel and wandering the picturesque harbour and historic streets. Pause at a local artisan shop to browse unique crafts and souvenirs.

Lighthouse Experience: Experience the coastal elegance of Martha's Vineyard, where iconic lighthouses and rich maritime heritage meet timeless New England charm. Conclude in Edgartown, renowned for its stately captains' homes and refined seaside atmosphere.</p><p>Anchored: 08:00 - 17:00</p>

Day 11: New York, New York (United States)
