## Itinerary

### Day 1: Amsterdam (Netherlands)

Your journey begins in the picturesque city of Amsterdam. Getting lost in its labyrinth of narrow laneways and canals lined with beautifully preserved 17th century buildings and charming cafés is one of the great ways to spend a day. Visiting in December you'll be able to marvel at the festive Christmas trees lining historic squares which creates a magical yuletide atmosphere.

This afternoon, board your all-inclusive ultra-luxury Scenic Space-Ship and settle into your suite. Relax and raise your glass to the days ahead at this evening's welcome reception.

Arrives On: 21 Dec 27

### Day 2: Amsterdam (Netherlands)

Amsterdam is a treasure trove of architectural beauty. Often referred to as the 'Venice of the North', much of the World Heritage-listed canal system exists today as it did hundreds of

years ago, lined with well-preserved canal houses and intersected by charming bridges.

**Scenic Freechoice:** Explore the region on one of these Scenic Freechoice excursions:

Canal cruise: Amsterdam has more than 100 kilometres of canals and today you will see some of the most picturesque sights of the city from these historical waterways on this one-hour cruise.

Walking tour of Amsterdam: Explore Amsterdam on foot, discovering the maze of canals and bridges in the city centre. Your guide will be covering history, modern lifestyle and Dutch culture. You also get to taste herring, a local delicacy not to be missed.

Excursion to Schermerhorn and Alkmaar: Windmills are an iconic feature of Dutch culture. Enjoy the sweeping countryside landscape and explore the nearby villages of Schermerhorn, home to a number of World Heritage-listed windmills dating back to the 16th century, and Alkmaar.

This afternoon, cruise towards the cosmopolitan metropolis of Cologne, Germany.

Arrives On: 22 Dec 27

### Day 3: Cologne (Germany)

Arrive in the 2,000 year old city of Cologne early this afternoon. Cologne suffered extensive damage during World War II but was painstakingly restored over the following decades. Set out on a walking tour of the Old Town, admiring its historic buildings, beautiful squares and the World Heritage-listed Cologne Cathedral. The city is also home to one of the most spectacular Christmas trees in the Rhineland, which is the centrepiece of the Cathedral Christmas Market in front of the gothic masterpiece that is Kölner Dom.

With a later departure tonight, you will have some free time to explore the city on your own and soak up more of the festive spirit.

Arrives On: 23 Dec 27

### Day 4: Rudesheim (Germany)

Relax on board this morning as you cruise through the picturesque Rhine Gorge, where the landscapes could have been pulled from the pages of a fairytale. This 65 kilometre stretch of the river is dotted with some 40 hilltop castles and fortresses that span a period of 1,000 years. Look out for the Lorelei statue, dedicated to the tragic legend of a beautiful maiden.

After lunch you will disembark in Rudesheim, a charming town surrounded by steep vineyards. In the historic centre you'll find half-timbered houses lining cobbled streets, a smattering of wine taverns, and open-air beer gardens.

Later, visit Siegfried's Musikkabinett Museum. Arrive at this quirky museum via mini train, where a local guide will introduce you to its weird and wonderful mechanical musical instruments. Afterwards, explore the surrounding streets on your own.

### Day 6: Würzburg (Germany)

Cruise into Würzburg this morning. This Baroque city straddles the Main River in the heart of Franconian wine country. Surrounded by undulating vineyards, Würzburg is home to a World Heritage-listed palace, a dominating hilltop fortress, the 15th century Old Main Bridge, and three universities including Bavaria's oldest.

**Scenic Freechoice:**  
Choose between these immersive Scenic Freechoice experiences today:  
Guided city tour: A short transfer via coach is needed to get to the centre of Würzburg. Your local guide will show you their hometown as you stroll towards the historic market square, when you will have time to wander.  
Romantic Road to Rothenburg: From Würzburg drive by coach to Rothenburg along the Romantic Road, an important trading route during the Middle Ages. Take a guided tour in Rothenburg, famous for its well-preserved medieval Old Town, admiring the Gothic and Renaissance City Hall as well as the famous City Councillors' Tavern.

### Day 7: Bamberg (Germany)

Cruise into Bamberg this afternoon and join a guided tour to explore the World Heritage-listed Old Town. A charming Old Town Hall which occupies an island on its own, a Gothic and Romanesque-style cathedral and the Old and New Residences – an episcopal palace, a quaint 'Little Venice' and a 12th century castle that teeters on the highest of the seven hills – are some of the incredible places you'll see during your guided city tour.

### Day 8: Nuremberg (Germany)

You will arrive in Nuremberg, Bavaria's second-largest city, this morning. Boasting an Old Town protected by an ancient city wall, this city is dominated by one of the most significant imperial forts of the Holy Roman Empire, the 12th century Imperial Castle, which was the preferred residence of German kings.

**Scenic Freechoice:**  
Today enjoy Scenic Freechoice your way:  
Walking tour of the Old Town: You will drive into Nuremberg's city centre, where your local guide will take you on a walking tour to see the Imperial Castle which overlooks the city, St. Egidien's Church and market square.  
World War II tour - Art Bunker visit: Much of the cities artistic heritage survived the aerial bombings of WWII thanks to medieval cellars dug into the sandstone of Nuremberg's castle hill. Discover how a simple but effective air-conditioning system and moisture-proof storage cells helped protect masterpieces.  
Nuremberg's Castle and City Walls: The historic city of Nuremberg is yours to explore during this active walking tour. Wander the cobblestone streets surrounding the Imperial Castle and admire the impressive city walls that have stood strong since medieval times.

Arrives On: 28 Dec 27

### Day 9: Regensburg (Germany)

You will arrive in Regensburg after lunch today. Set on the confluence of three rivers in Bavaria, Regensburg is a delight to explore. Its medieval Old Town is one Germany's largest and it's also a World Heritage site.

**Scenic Freechoice:** Be immersed in Regensburg with your choice of Scenic Freechoice excursions:

Regensburg walking tour: Your expert local guide will show you the old stone bridge, the Church of St. James, and the Porta Praetoria all while sharing the customs and traditions of the region during the festive period.

Bavarian beer tasting: Visit a series of traditional breweries, learn about the intricacies of brewing and sample a variety of distinctive Bavarian beers, from the crisp refreshment of Helles lager to the smooth richness of Dunkel and the fruity, spicy character of Weissbier.

### Day 10: Passau (Germany)

Set on the confluence of the Danube, Inn and Ilz rivers, Passau has been an important trading city since medieval times, particularly for salt, commonly known as 'white gold'. Each river is distinct in colour and some days you can clearly see the green, blue and black hues where the waters meet. At the centre of the Baroque city, the 13th century Italianate Old Town is packed with tight laneways tunnels and archways, including an 'Artist's mile' where old buildings are occupied by artist studios, workshops and galleries.

**Scenic Freechoice:** Choose from three completely different yet equally fascinating full day Scenic Freechoice excursions:

Full day excursion to Salzburg: Journey via coach to Salzburg, Austria. Surrounded by alpine peaks and on the banks of the Salzach River, Salzburg is best known as the home of Mozart and The Sound of Music. During a guided tour, explore this incredible city before enjoying lunch at a local restaurant.

Full day excursion to Český Krumlov: From Passau journey via coach to the Czech town of Český Krumlov. This delightful World Heritage-listed town is brimming with charm. Wander this fairytale location with your guide and explore the historic centre before a delicious lunch at a local restaurant.

Highlights of Passau - with St. Stephens Cathedral: Passau's rich history dates back over two millennia to Celtic and Roman times. Its historic centre was largely rebuilt in Baroque style after a devastating fire in 1662, giving it a distinctive Mediterranean flair. The city features striking landmarks such as the Baroque St. Stephen's Cathedral with the largest cathedral organ in the world, the Veste Oberhaus fortress, and beautifully preserved old town streets hosting museums, galleries, and cafes.
