Itinerary

Day 1: Prague (Czech Republic)

Your journey begins in the glorious city of Prague, the capital of the Czech Republic that until 1989 was behind the Iron Curtain. The city is home to one of Europe's best preserved city centres, with its architecture dating to the 14th century, and despite the number being closer to 1,000, its nickname 'City of a Hundred Spires' remains today. Upon arrival, you'll be transferred to your luxurious hotel, the Prague Marriott Hotel or similar, for a two-night stay. This evening, join your fellow travellers and your expert Scenic Tour Director for a welcome drink.

Arrives On: 18 Aug 27

Day 2: Prague (Czech Republic)

Discover one of Europe's most magical cities during a guided tour this morning. You will pass the Jewish Quarter and Jan Palach Square, considered one of Prague's most striking. Cross

the medieval stone arch of Charles Bridge and visit the Old Town Square, where you will see the famous Astronomical Clock. Legend has it that the designer of this masterpiece was blinded on completion so he could never make another piece as beautiful.

You will have some free time to wander the city and enjoy lunch before your choice of Scenic Freechoice this afternoon.

Tastes of Czechia: Join your local guide and learn about the culinary profile of Prague, known for hearty traditional comfort food. Today sample local favourites including pickles, cheeses and traditional cakes.

Prague Castle tour: Known as the world's largest ancient castle complex, Prague Castle dates back to 880 AD and still serves today as the Czech Presidents office. Explore some of this majestic site visiting St. Vitus Cathedral, the largest cathedral in the Czech Republic, as well as the Old Royal Palace, the former residence of Bohemian Royalty and the picturesque Golden Lane.

Tonight, join your fellow guests for a traditional Czech dinner in a local restaurant in the heart of the city.

Day 3: Prague (Czech Republic)

This morning, you'll depart for Dresden, known as 'Florence on the Elbe'. Considered one of the greenest cities in Germany, Dresden is famed for its music and culture.

Today, enjoy an orientation tour to see the Frauenkirche Church, which was reduced to rubble after the Second World War and took 60 years to rebuild, the Castle of the Electors of Saxony, the Semper Opera House, and Zwinger Courtyard in the heart of the Old Town.

Afterwards, continue through the picturesque Spreewald Forest to Germany's capital, Berlin, for a three-night Scenic Special Stay at the Grand Hyatt Berlin.

Day 4: Berlin (Germany)

Berlin is a city of contrasts, possessing both beauty and grit, historic architecture and cutting-edge design, and a vibrant youthful vibe with a tumultuous history. On a guided tour, you'll see the 18th century neoclassical Brandenburg Gate and the traditional State Opera

House. Drive the famous 'Unter den Linden', a boulevard to the City Palace, and visit Checkpoint Charlie, the former border crossing between east and west Berlin. This afternoon, join a local guide to discover Charlottenburg Palace, Berlin's most beautiful former royal summer residence, with its dazzling Porcelain Room, elegant palace chapel, extensive French-style gardens and the royal mausoleum.

Day 5: Berlin (Germany)

Spend the day exploring the city of Berlin and learn about its Cold War history or venture to the nearby city of Potsdam. **Scenic Freechoice:** Explore your way with a choice from the following Scenic Freechoice excursions:
Berlin Wall and Hackesche Hofe: Visit the Berlin Wall Memorial, built to remember the Cold War that divided Berlin from 1961 to 1989, and see the only stretch of the infamous wall that remains. Continue by subway to Hackesche Hofe, wandering eight early 21st century courtyards comprising Art Nouveau buildings that are now used as shops and cafes.
Visit New Palace & Potsdam: Journey to Potsdam, where a local historian will share insights into the town that was once founded by Prussian kings some 300 years ago. Delve into its history before a guided tour of the Baroque New Palace built in 1763.

Day 6: Berlin (Germany)

Cross the border into Poland, towards the city of Warsaw. You will stop along the way in the city of Poznan, known for its colourful narrow merchant houses built in the 16th century. The capital of Poland was completely rebuilt after it was razed during the Second World War, which is why it's often referred to as the Phoenix City. Whole neighbourhoods have been revitalised, and today it is rich in culture and has a thriving dining scene and nightlife.

Largely destroyed during World War II, Warsaw's historic centre has been resurrected and has attained World Heritage-listed status. Your local guide will take you through the city's key sites including the Jewish Ghetto, where some 380,000 Jews were sealed

inside during the war. You'll also visit the monument to the ghetto heroes, and the Palace of Culture and Science.

Scenic Freechoice: Today you have two fascinating tours to choose from with this afternoon's Scenic Freechoice:

Pierogi cooking class: Learn to make Poland's national dish, Pierogi – traditional dumplings that have been a favourite meal since the 13th century. After an immersive cooking class, you will have the opportunity to taste the finished product.

Wilanów Palace: Step into Poland's royal past with a guided visit to the magnificent Wilanów Palace, often called the 'Polish Versailles'. Wander through opulent Baroque halls filled with priceless artworks, admire richly decorated chambers that once hosted King Jan III Sobieski and hear the stories that shaped this grand estate.

Scenic Enrich: Tonight, enjoy an exclusive classical music concert inside a grand Polish manor house. Be immersed in the immortal music of Chopin followed by an elegant dinner.

Day 8: Warsaw (Poland)

Travel to Kraków today, stopping enroute at Auschwitz, where you'll visit the former German Nazi concentration camp. In operation from 1940 to 1945, more than one million Jews tragically died here. Take a poignant walk through the grounds, made up of original camp blocks, barracks and guard towers, and see the museum which houses personal possessions of the prisoners and the SS garrison who perpetrated the crimes committed here on a moving tour paying your respects to the atrocities that took place.

This afternoon continue to Krakow, arriving early this evening. Poland's former royal capital until 1596, Krakow is the only major Polish city that wasn't reduced to rubble in the Second World War.

This afternoon, travel to the 800 year old Wieliczka Salt Mines, which are made up of around 245 kilometres of corridors, underground chambers and saline lakes. Admire statues of historic and mythical figures, sculpted by miners out of rock salt and view old mining tools and machines. Tonight, enjoy delicious Polish cuisine at a local restaurant.

Cross the border into Slovakia enroute to the Hungarian capital, Budapest. Divided by the Danube, with Buda on one side and Pest on the other, this city became united in 1873 when a newly built bridge connected the two. Day 15: Passau (Germany)

Arrive in Passau today. Set at the meeting point of three rivers and close to the border with Austria, Passau was an important trading point for centuries. It was also a significant town in the Holy Roman Empire, and the charming Old Town was mostly built by powerful prince-bishops in an Italianate style.

Scenic Freechoice: Select from the following Scenic Freechoice excursions:

Full day excursion to Salzburg: Cross the border into Salzburg, Austria, a storybook city surrounded by alpine peaks and best known as the home of Mozart and The Sound of Music. On a guided tour, learn about its art and music scene, visit Mozart's birthplace, and see the vast Hohensalzburg Fortress. Enjoy lunch at a local restaurant and some free time.

Full day excursion to Český Krumlov: Journey to the World Heritage-listed town of Český Krumlov, brimming with charm. Explore with your local guide, admire the well-preserved Gothic, Renaissance and Baroque architecture, and enjoy lunch in a local restaurant.

Highlights of Passau: Join your local guide on a walking tour, admiring the brightly coloured buildings that line the waterways. Visit St Stephens Cathedral, originally built in the year 450 but destroyed by fire in 1662 and rebuilt in the Baroque style.

Day 16: Regensburg (Germany)

Boasting a staggering 2,000 year history, Regensburg has one of Germany's best preserved medieval town centres, with more than 900 of its Romanesque and Gothic buildings listed as World Heritage sites. Within its narrow laneways, the city lays claim to having the highest concentration of bars in the country.

Scenic Freechoice:

Today, Regensburg offers a selection of Scenic Freechoice activities to choose from:

Walking tour of Regensburg: On the confluence of three rivers in Bavaria, Regensburg is known as the best-preserved medieval city in Germany. Guests will join a walking tour with a local guide to see the old stone bridge, the Church of St James, and the Porta Praetoria.

Weltenburg Abbey: Take a ferry through the Danube Gorge to Weltenburg Abbey, the oldest monastery in Bavaria, founded by monks in approximately 600AD. Explore the Abbey and Cloister Church, then sample the award-winning beer produced on site since 1050.

Thurn und Taxis active walking tour: Join an active walking tour from the ship to Thurn und Taxis Castle, for a guided tour followed by free time. Thurn und Taxis is a German noble family who can trace their history back to the 12th century.

Cycle to Walhalla Memorial: Cycle through the wonderful scenery of the Danube Valley along the river and through the countryside, to Walhalla Memorial. Commissioned by King Ludwig I of Bavaria, Walhalla Memorial honours notable Germans from past centuries.

Day 17: Nuremberg (Germany)

Cruise into Nuremberg, Bavaria's second-largest city, where the Old Town is protected by an ancient city wall. The city is dominated by one of the most significant imperial forts of the Holy Roman Empire, the 12th century Imperial Castle, which was the preferred residence of German kings.

Behind its charming facade, Nuremberg also has a turbulent history. During WWII, the city was favoured by the Nazis for party rallies and many of the anti-Jewish laws began here. By 1945, the city was reduced to rubble, including large sections of the Imperial Castle and Old Town. After the war, Nazi leaders were tried here for their war

Day 18: Bamberg (Germany)

Admire the charming Town Hall which occupies an island on its own, a Gothic and Romanesque-style cathedral, and the Old and New Residences – comprising an episcopal palace, a picturesque 'Little Venice' and a 12th century castle that teeters on the highest of the seven hills.

Guided tour of Bamberg Old Town: Bamberg is known for its charming World Heritage-listed Old Town, one of Europe's largest intact old town centres. Learn about its fascinating history as you wander through stunning medieval and Baroque buildings on a guided city tour.
Excursion to Coburg: Journey via coach to Coburg, which was the seat of Queen Victoria's husband Prince Albert and has close ties to the British royal family. Visit the impressive castle, which looks over the city, and is considered one of the largest and best-preserved forts in Germany. Its museum houses a large collection of carriages, weapons, armoury and paintings by renowned artists.

Schnapps tasting: Visit a local schnapps distiller to understand how this flavoured liqueur is produced. Enjoy a tasting of the multiple flavours before taking an orientation tour of Miltenberg followed by some free time to enjoy the town.

This 65-kilometre stretch of the river is dotted with some 40 hilltop castles and fortresses that span a period of 1000 years.
